EXPLORING BENEFITS

High School Diploma Program for WWI, WWII, Korea and Vietnam Veterans

For Veterans who served between:



April 6, 1917 and Nov. 11, 1918 (World War I) Dec. 7, 1941 and Dec. 31, 1946 (World War II) June 27, 1950 and Jan. 31, 1955 (Korea) or Aug. 5, 1964 and May 7, 1975 (Vietnam) may apply to the Indiana Department of Veterans Affairs for issuance of a high school diploma.

Veterans must have:

- Attended public or nonpublic high school in Indiana prior to military service
- Been a student in good standing
- Not graduated or received a diploma because of leaving high school for military service
- and been honorably discharged from the armed forces of the United States
- Veterans, or their surviving spouses or eligible family members, may submit an <u>application</u> to the Department of Veteran Affairs.

ROLL CALL

The <u>Indiana Veterans Memorial Cemetery</u> is dedicated to Veterans and their families as a lasting memorial, and final resting place, in appreciation and gratitude for their service and sacrifice to our nation.

To be eligible for burial:

- The veteran must have been separated under conditions other than dishonorable
- If Guard or Reserve, must have been eligible for retirement pay at the time of death
- Servicemember who died while serving on active duty
- The surviving spouse of an eligible veteran or
- A child under the age of 21 of an eligible veteran.
