Drawn to Reading Bookmarks Coming to Your Library in June

Those colorful, award-winning "Drawn to Reading Reading" bookmarks drawn from the imagination of young Hoosiers are back!

This innovative program from Ball State

University has again donated thousands of bookmarks to the Indiana State Library for distribution to public libraries across the state.

"Drawn to Reading" is a service-learning project promoting literacy and art education through the creative potential of young people and their immersion into the graphic communications industry. These collaborative efforts yield the printing of colorful and creative bookmarks for the distribution to local libraries to promote literacy and reading. The program is a partnership between Muncie elementary-school students, who create the artwork, and Ball State University students, who digitize the artwork. This project was made possible thanks to the in-kind printing services provided by Excell Color Graphics of Fort Wayne.

This year's collection consists of several different and colorful bookmarks that will be distributed to all public library districts on INfo Express. School libraries on INfo Express, or those that can make arrangements for INfo Express delivery via their local public library, can request materials by emailing Ejuanda Fields at fejuanda@library.in.gov.
