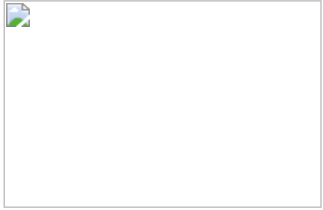

The Indiana State Library, in partnership with [Net Literacy](#), is offering another 150 free, rebuilt public access computers and monitors to any public or institutional library in Indiana. These refurbished computers are all running Windows 7 and have a minimum of 1GB ram, 40GB or larger hard drives, ethernet cards, antivirus software and are internet-ready.

Net Literacy was founded in 2003 by a central Indiana middle school student when he was asked to teach a group of senior citizens how to use the Internet. Today Net Literacy is a student run organization with over 3,500 student volunteers who spend countless hours to rebuild used computers and provide them to retirement homes, community centers, and in partnership with the State Library, to public libraries all over the state. Since 2011, Net Literacy and the Indiana State Library have provided nearly 500 rebuilt computers and over 300 monitors to Indiana libraries.

Posting a job on the site is easy!

- 1) Go to the ISL Continuing Education website - Jobs page: <http://continuinged.isl.in.gov/jobs/>
- 2) Click on Submit a library job: <http://continuinged.isl.in.gov/jobs/submit-job/>
- 3) Create an account to submit a library job and to edit or delete a posting. All you have to do to create an account is enter your email address into the first box in the form: <http://continuinged.isl.in.gov/jobs/submit-job/step-two/>
- 4) Enter as much information into the rest of the form as you can. We suggest that you include the expiration date in the Description blurb however the system will automatically delete the entry 6 months after it is published.
- 5) Click on Preview job listing which will give you the chance to review your draft posting before you approve the final version.
- 6) Your final step is clicking on Submit Listing.
- 7) Once ISL staff approve your job, it will display on the Jobs page (see step 1). Automatic email notification that your library posting has been approved and is posted is not currently part of this process but it may be available in the future.
- 8) Those with an account can also log into the account to edit/delete the job entry: http://continuinged.isl.in.gov/jobs/edit_delete_entry/
