National Library Week: National Library Week, an annual celebration of the contributions of our nation's libraries and librarians, is being celebrated April 14 through 20. This year's theme, "Communities Matter @ your library," is designed to let patrons know that whether you are a job seeker looking for resources to land a new job, a parent looking for free activities for children or a student searching for your next favorite book, the library is there for them.

The ALA also offers programming advice, website graphics, calendars of events, and advocacy toolkits to help raise awareness of your National Library Week activities.

You can also order "Communities Matter @ your library" materials at the ALA Store. Promotional materials include a poster, bookmark, mini poster, and downloadable web icons and art files. However, order quickly to ensure your materials arrive by April 8.

Indiana Humanities Receives Special Collection from NEH, ALA



Indiana Humanities recently received a set of 25 books comprising the Muslim Journeys Bookshelf. A program of the National Endowment for the Humanities & ALA, it is designed to help public audiences become more familiar with the people, places, history, faith and

cultures of Muslims around the world and within the United States.

Indiana Humanities also lends over 450 sets of titles statewide via Novel Conversations. The lending library is open to any Indiana library or civic book club free of charge and book sets are deliverable via INfoExpress. Books are primarily fiction and biography, and include classic titles such as Little Women and To Kill a Mockingbird , as well as contemporary titles such as The Poisonwood Bible and The Time Traveler's Wife.

New material from the Crawfordsville Land Office is now available through the nationally-recognized Indiana Digital Archives. The Crawfordsville Land Office Index includes more than 38,000 records of purchases of public lands from Benton, Boone, Carroll, Clay, Clinton, Fountain, Hendricks, Monroe, Montgomery, Morgan, Owen, Parke, Putnam, Tippecanoe, Vermillion, Warren, and White Counties. Sales of public land at the Crawfordsville Land Office began in September of 1820 and continued until 1853...learn more.
