<u>Block parties help teach state's</u> <u>history</u> Allen County Public Library There were sessions on business women's work, crime and reformation, and discrimination and compensation for women's work. In a section on war production, we learned about the little-known work of Mexican-American women in Northern Indiana's steel plants during World War II and the Japanese War-Brides' challenges in factory work in the 1950s. We also heard about the work of college women during war periods and their many efforts to serve Hoosiers. In the session about the changing attitudes on women's work, the presenters spoke about the personal and societal transitions of women's "duties" and "place" in history, and how women had always contributed to our economy through our agricultural heritage. Continuing the theme of agriculture heritage, one speaker talked about the impact that land cession treaties between Native American tribes and the US Government had on the nature of the Miami women's work. The final session was a panel discussion on the future access and preservation efforts relating to women's history. All in all, it was a fun and informative day!


