"How did Ray Bradbury, a child of the Great Depression and too poor to attend college, rise to become one of the best known authors of the 20th century?" The Ray Bradbury Center at IUPUI attempts to answer this question with its latest exhibit. The exhibit includes an important artifact from Bradbury's early reading years that has never been on display before.

The Bradbury Center is one of the larger single-author archives in the United States, and a hub for scholarship on the work of Bradbury and science fiction. The Center is home to more than 100,000 pages of published and unpublished literary works stored in 31 of the author's filing cabinets; 40 years of Bradbury's personal and professional correspondence an additional 10,000 pages; and author's copies of Bradbury books, including extensive foreign language editions, and his working library - a combined 4,000 volumes.

Navigating GovInfo



Beginning a search in <u>GovInfo</u> can feel a bit like Theseus staring at the entrance to the labyrinth. Yet, there are ways to effectively navigate all the site has to offer without growing overwhelmed. One such way to "enter the labyrinth" with one's own jeweled thread is to choose search terms that are practical, simple and repetitive.

If one employs the term fact sheet and links it with a specific topic, one usually ends up with viable and manageable results. Many government agencies generate highquality fact sheets that explain the agency's mission or provide answers to frequently asked questions. A HUD fact sheet, for example, provides information on calculating one's rent to make sure one is not overpaying. The Consumer Price Index fact sheet, compiled by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, measures changes in prices for services and materials, from airline tickets to college tuition. It also includes information on how changes are determined.

Fact Sheets developed by the
National Science Foundation break
down what agencies are doing
globally, nationally and locally,
while those generated by the
National Foundation for the Arts
offer glimpses into the arts around
the country and the institutions that
fund and promote accessibility.
