Participation in the survey will give library leaders up-to-date and accurate information about staffing and diversity and will also contribute to powerful, actionable and inspirational results for library staff across the country. Participation also helps PLA create tools, resources and professional development opportunities that are useful for advancing equity in libraries. The results will provide nationally representative data to inform and engage elected officials, the media and funders to increase awareness of and support for library workers. The 2021 survey data will create a baseline. When this survey is next administered in 2024, PLA will be able to see how the field has evolved. Survey results will be available in a freely and publicly accessible report.

Upcoming EBSCO administrative and statistical webinars

library service was established by an Act of Congress in 1931 to provide blind adults with books in an embossed format. The Act was amended in 1934 to include sound recordings (also known as talking books); expanded in 1952 to include children; and in 1962 to provide music material; and again in 1966, to include individuals with physical limitations that prevent them from reading regular print. Recently, two important changes to the Talking Book program were made. One allows students with reading disabilities to qualify, and the other is an international agreement that considerably increases the number of foreign titles available.

The service is free to any United States resident, whether living at home or abroad, who is unable to read in a traditional fashion. Books, be they braille, large print or audio, are shipped back and forth through the United States Postal Service at no cost. Players are also made available to patrons as are electronic files that can be downloaded to smart phones, tablets and braille ereaders. Accounts are also available to institutions.

Patrons can select books using catalogs sent every two months, by chatting with a reader advisor, searching the online catalog or all of the above. It is as easy as filling out an <u>application</u> and having it signed by a certifying authority.

In Indiana, the Talking Book program is housed in the State Library. Staff can be reached via email. They work with libraries to supply fliers, instructions and even talking-book machines, if librarians wish to demonstrate how the program works.
