## Newbery Honor author Jasmine Warga to visit IndyPL's Central Library on Nov. 3



Jasmine Warga, a Newbery Honor and New York Times-bestselling author, will visit the Indianapolis Public Library's Central Library on Nov. 3 at 6:30 p.m. to speak about her books and writing. Book sales courtesy of Kids Ink, as well as a book signing, will be available following the event.

Warga writes young adult and middle grade novels. "Other Words for Home," a 2020 Newbery Honor Book, follows a Syrian girl who moves to Cincinnati and explores questions of belonging. Her latest novel, "A Rover's Story," follows a Mars rover who is tested in ways that go beyond space exploration and finds the determination, courage and resilience to succeed and survive. She is the author of young adult books "My Heart and Other Black Holes" and "Here We Are Now," which have been translated into over twenty different languages. Jasmine currently teaches in the MFA program at Vermont College of Fine Arts.

"We are excited to welcome Jasmine to The Indianapolis Public Library for an author talk," said Devery North, program specialist with Indianapolis Public Library. "It is thrilling to have a visit from an author who writes for a middle grade audience. On April 4-7, 2023, the National Network of Libraries of Medicine will present a "Virtual Health Misinformation Symposium." The free virtual symposium will explore the research behind health misinformation movements and provide practical and evidence-based solutions to support librarians, health educators and direct care providers in combating the spread of all types of health misinformation. Sign up to be notified when registration opens.

NNLM is still accepting presentation proposals until Oct. 31. Topics may include types of misinformation; history of health misinformation; tips to understand health research; combating social media spread; the effects of health misinformation on individuals and communities; and highlighting replicable programs that Network members can implement to address health misinformation.

The symposium will offer a keynote each day, along with hour presentations and panels of 10-minute lightning talks from 12-5:30 p.m.

Proposal objectives should distinguish between the types of misinformation; describe current research regarding health misinformation; identify and implement resources and tools to combat health misinformation; and explore programs, projects and practices related to health misinformation in communities.

Proposals are accepted through an <u>online form.</u> Submissions are due by Oct. 31 at 12 a.m. Eastern Time. NNLM is on the Indiana State
