Those who would like their Indiana library job posting to be listed in the Wednesday Word must submit the position and its description to the growth of telehealth and telemedicine visits continuing beyond the COVID-19 pandemic, individuals are finding more ways to reach their healthcare providers.

However, in rural areas, finding local providers and reliable internet access can create a barrier to access. As public libraries have long been viewed as the central hub for information, gatherings and broadband service, their pivot to serve as a place for patrons to meet virtually with social workers comes at an opportune time. This presentation will show how three public libraries developed a pilot program - titled "Because You Matter" - with the Indiana University School of Social Work to coordinate weekly telehealth visits with social work students and library patrons. They'll share successes, failures and what they learned to improve the program in the future.

Presenters include Stephanie Rawlins, director of the Pike County Public Library; Jordan Orwig, director of the Sullivan County Public Library; and Nathan Watson, director of the Bedford Public Library.

The Indianapolis Public Schools
Architecture Collection is the
newest addition to the Library's
Digital Indy archive, which
includes collections of documents,
images, videos and recordings that
highlight local history. Digital
Indy's content may be printed or
downloaded free for personal use,
study or research.

The Indianapolis Public Schools
Architecture Collection spans three
centuries and includes documents
from the 1890s through the 1970s.
The educational priorities of
various time periods are reflected
in the design of buildings and how
they were used. For example,
school floor plans that highlight
what was taught in classrooms
during various time periods reveal
rooms designated for clothing
laboratory, cabinet making shop
and other subjects that are hard to
find in modern schools.

"The architecture depicted in this collection is the physical manifestation of the complicated history of the IPS school system at large," said Indianapolis Public Library's digital projects coordinator Katie Farmer. "The priorities of society and culture are reflected in how the educational system developed and evolved, and images of a coal storage room inside of a school can show how the technical aspects of the buildings have changed over the decades."

The collection has been preserved in large part due to the IPS Facilities Management Division and will continue to be stored on IPS grounds. The digitization of these materials was made possible When: Dec. 9, 10 a.m.-12 p.m. Where: Bremen Public Library

Minde Browning Fund professional development grants available to Marion County libraries



The Minde Browning
Fund, administered by The
Indianapolis Foundation, provides
small professional development
grants - up to \$1,000 - to staff
serving in eligible Marion County
libraries. The Indianapolis
Foundation and local donors
established this endowed fund in
1999 as a tribute to Minde Glenn
Browning, the former assistant
director at the IU School of Law Indianapolis Law Library and chair
of the Library Fund Steering
Committee.

Grants may be used to cover the cost of registration, materials, travel and lodging to attend professional conferences and workshops, professional coursework, leadership development programs and group programs related to libraries, media centers, etc.

Eligible libraries include the Indianapolis Public Library; any high school library - public, private or charter - in Marion County; and academic libraries at IUPUI, Marian University and the University of Indianapolis. High school libraries do not need to have a full-time media specialist in order to apply for a grant.

Indiana Department of Veterans
Affairs has state-specific details on
state benefits and the location of
County Veterans Service Offices,
which provide assistance to veterans
and their family members.

Indiana's Department of Workforce Development serves veterans by helping with searches for employment and easing the transition to civilian life. Lastly, one can apply for the Military Family Relief Fund here. The fund provides financial assistance with housing, utilities, food, medical expenses and transportation.
