The area proposed for classification as a National Historic District encompasses only a portion of the 200 acre Indiana State Soldiers Home. The tract is located along a high bluff overlooking the Wabash River and includes the main entrance to the Home, the Post Exchange, the Commandants House, Library Building (formerly the Commissary) and the Administration Building. The entire area is heavily wooded.

The central focus of the area is the complex containing the Commandant's House, Library and Administration buildings. These three structures are the only remaining representatives of the original architectural style of the Soldiers Home, and are indicative of the excellent master planning of the Home. Utilizing a paladium tripartite concept, the major central element is the massive Commandant's House with the Administration building to the north and Library to the south serving as flanking servant elements.

The Commandants House is a fine example of the ante-bellum architecture so popular during the 1890's. The exterior of the House is architecturally striking as far as massing the scale relative to the site, particularly interms of the original vistas to the east over the Wabash Valley and to the west relative to the parade grounds and flanking buildings. The major architectural feature is the front portice and entry. Because of the dramatization of the entry doorway relative to the size of the House, the entry appears much larger than it actually is. The striking white wood shingling causes the building to stand out in contrast to its wooded surroundings. The interior of the building shows an interesting combination of functional utilitarian design and grandness of concept commensurate with the exterior. The central stairway is a prime example of this functionalism, moving the visitor up the levels of the House without a feeling of climbing. Additional interior features are the nicely carved wood work and the drawing room fireplace with its bas relief frieze.

The Library and Administration buildings flanking the Commandants House are of brick with white wood trim. Both buildings are excellent examples of late nineteenth century institutional architecture, representatives of which are rapidly vanishing. The Commandants House and Library are unaltered; some modification has taken place on the Administration building.

The Post Exchange building is located north of the three structures described above. A one story frame building done in green and white, it is somewhat later than the other buildings. However, it is an interesting and almost unique example of the institutional "cottage" architecture of the period. It is still in use today and its atmosphere substantially reflects life at the Soldiers Home during the early twentieth century. It is unaltered.

The grounds surrounding these buildings and comprising the remainder of the district are located on top of a major bluff some 150 feet above the Wabash River valley, which the site overlooks. Dominated by original oaks, maple and hickory, the heavily wooded area is a prime example of how indiginous woodlands and architectural elements may be combined to create a pleasing whole.

of the Civil War who, for various reasons, were no longer capable of taking care of themselves. Intensive lobbying by the Grand Army of the Republic resulted in the Indiana State Assembly of 1888 resolving to found a Home for veterans, and in 1890 work toward the Home was begun.

Located on 200 acres of land north of Lafayette, Indiana, the Home represented a major and unprecedented effort in the state's activity in humanitarian activities. By 1900, numerous buildings had been erected for the use of the inmates of the Home, and the applications for residence at the Home were far greater than its facilities were capable of handling. This state of affairs continued, and by 1950 it was apparent that a major revamping of the Home was needed. This revamping resulted in the destruction of almost all the original buildings, and today only four structures remain from the earlier years of the institution.

The proposed Historic District encompasses some nine acres of land which remains in its original state, and contains the four original buildings: The Commandants House, Library (formerly the Commissary), Administration Building, and Post Exchange. In addition, a collection of some two hundred oil portraits of Civil War generals, painted by Captain Alexander Lawrie, are housed in the Library. Valued at \$150,000, this collection of art by a relatively unknown American artist adds a major cultural dimension to the district.

The importance of the Soldiers Home District is far greater than the sum of its parts. Combining interesting and rapidly vanishing architectural features with fine landscaping and site maintenance, as well as the Lawrie Collection, the proposed Historic District preserves an almost forgotten segment of Indiana's social history, and allows the visitor to recreate the early years of the Soldiers Home in his own mind by participating in a living portion of the original grounds, buildings and atmosphere of the Indiana State Soldiers Home.
