



## Indiana Arts Commission FY27 Arts Project Support (APS) Grant Program College and University Project Eligibility

### Overview

The Indiana Arts Commission's (IAC) Arts Project Support (APS) grant program provides funding to support public-facing short-term arts projects or a series of arts activities. Examples include performances, exhibits, arts festivals, arts and cultural planning, arts learning for specific populations such as older adults or youth, public art, or some other arts-based or arts-serving activity. The goal of the program is to provide Indiana's people and communities with access to arts experiences.

The IAC's vision is arts activity in all of Indiana's 92 counties, and this is supported by new programs and modified existing programs to achieve that outcome.

One resulting change to the Arts Project Support program is to eligibility for college and university applicants as outlined below.

### APS Eligibility

Applicants representing private and public colleges and universities are eligible to apply with projects that provide either:

- **Community arts learning experiences for grades Pre-K through 12** on their home campus or elsewhere;
- **or**
- Arts experiences in **high-priority geographic service counties** designated by the IAC based on factors such as a lack of existing arts access or a history of underinvestment.

For the FY27 APS program cycle, those counties are as follows:

No other projects from College and University applicants will be eligible in the FY27 APS program cycle.

### **APS Eligibility Tool**

All new and returning APS applicants are required to answer some simple questions to find out if they can apply for the APS program before beginning an application. These questions are solely intended to help applicants determine whether they may be eligible to apply for APS.

Colleges and universities are required to request access to the APS application following completion of the eligibility tool. Instructions on how to request access to the application are provided upon completion of the eligibility tool.

Access to the application does not guarantee final eligibility for the program. The IAC reserves the authority to deem an applicant ineligible at any point in the application process.
