Susan Alterio Valparaiso, IN Porter Region 1 IN1, SSD4, SHD4 \$2,000.00	I will use these funds to expand my ability to photograph and capture video of nature through remote camera trapping, which is a method of capturing wild animals remotely. My biggest thrill is talking sharing my work with the local community. A couple of times a year, I partner with a local organization to give a workshop and photography walk to illustrate how to take better nature photographs.

This machine will enable me to streamline the time-consuming and laborious felting process, thus creating more examples of finished pieces for demonstrations, classes, exhibits, and purchases. My goal for this project is to organize and produce three free public presentations. These presentations will feature the many processes it takes to turn raw fleece into useable finished products such as yarn, handwoven fabric,
	and felted fabric. After raising a fleece-bearing animal, local 4-H groups will also be invited to see what creative applications are possible. These presentations will provide a basic understanding and appreciation of the creative textile processes and techniques and showcase finished works.
Allison Ballard Fort Wayne, IN Allen Region 3 IN3, SSD16, SHD50 \$2,000.00 Theatre	"I Am the One Who" is a trauma education performance project that inspires hope, healing, and dialogue. This one-woman show portrays a healing journey from a dissociative disorder to empowerment and tells how the first performing taiko group in Indiana was born. A biomythography, "I Am the One Who" celebrates the resiliency of the human spirit and the power of the expressive arts.
	The purpose of this project is to advance social change by educating professionals and supporting people through trauma-informed practices and ways to improve trauma-informed care. This will be achieved by developing/presenting a trauma-informed performance project that includes a 2-hour theatrical piece, a facilitated post-performance discussion, and supporting curriculum/workshops that explore the healing power of the expressive arts in trauma recovery.

Community Engagement plays a significant role in this project. The funds from the fellowship will help develop a prototype that I will use in pitch competitions. I have recently been accepted into a pitch competition that makes more funding available. This pitch competition, Pitch Pardi, is centered around a week of events promoting entrepreneurship, innovation, creative arts, and technology. The pitch competition is designed as a cohort to take the participants through a series of development workshops to expand an idea stage venture. This entire process requires me to engage on the community level to prepare a pitch and present it to the community.

During the completion of the project, I will be in direct communication with my fellow artists, who I have asked to make up a critique group that will inform my creative process. I will meet with the group on a bi-monthly basis. In addition, I will meet with the Arts Council of Southwestern Indiana staff several times during the completion of this project for ongoing feedback.
Manon Bullock Westfield, IN Marion Region 7 IN7, SSD7, SHD36 \$2,000.00	This project aims to use poetry and hip-hop recorded on an EP to create more social awareness around pervasive housing issues in Indiana. Before becoming a full-time artist, I worked at an organization that supported folks coming out of homelessness. I also have served on the board for the Fair Housing Center of Central Indiana for four years. This work has placed me in touch with the systemic barriers that minoritized and vulnerable populations encounter when finding housing stability. Each song will explore a different topic, such as eviction, gentrification, redlining, etc. After completing the album, I will create a tour schedule in the form of talkbacks, where I pair performance with a panel discussion on these topics. During these events, I'll invite folks from the impacted communities and those working on the issues to participate in discussions that can lead to actionable steps.

When unwell, the value of spaces for reflection and meditation dates back centuries, influencing later, more explicit humanistic ideals such as visual stimulation, color, and nature. One example from my career is the recent addition of an anatomical heart painting to the Dayson Heart Center at the Good Samaritan Hospital in Vincennes, Indiana. The bright, cheerful heart that hangs there replaced a macro photograph of a blooming pussy willow plant. The nurses and receptionists confessed they were relieved it was gone, as they were uncomfortable giving the plant's name to inquiring patients. My recent collaboration with a physical
	therapist to develop a line of anatomical tattoos in educational settings, while deferred by Covid, is another example of my experience working with healthcare providers in my community.
