

MINUTES
ALCOHOL AND TOBACCO COMMISSION
MARCH 17, 2026

CALL TO ORDER/NOTING OF QUORUM

Chairwoman Allen called the meeting to order and noted the quorum and the attendance. Vice Chairman Payne, Commissioner Maginn, Prosecutor Wignall, Deputy Director Serak, General Counsel Beaucaire and Senior Attorney Daphne Whitmire were in attendance.

DISPOSITION OF MINUTES

Vice Chairman Payne moved to approve the minutes from the March 3, 2026 meeting. Commissioner Maginn seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

PROSECUTOR'S RECOMMENDATIONS

PARTIES' AGREED DISPOSITIONS - Vice Chairman Payne moved to approve the Parties' Agreed Dispositions, submitted by Prosecutor Wignall. Forty-six dispositions were submitted with fines totaling \$29,925.00. Commissioner Maginn seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

HEARING JUDGE'S RECOMMENDATIONS

No Hearing Judge's Recommendations.

CONSIDERATION OF APPLICATIONS

Vice Chairman Payne moved to approve and incorporate by reference these lists of permits for renewal, which have been recommended by local boards and reviewed by said staff with the authority of the Commission, and hereby move for approval of the same, pending any escrow hearings, and the inclusion of these lists as part of the minutes. Commissioner Maginn seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

Vice Chairman Payne moved to approve and incorporate by reference these lists of permit applications for a new permit or application for changes in location, ownership, or both of existing permits, which have been recommended by local boards and reviewed by at least two Commissioners and hereby move for approval of same, pending final floor plan approval by the Indiana State Excise Police and escrow, if needed, and inclusion of these lists as part of the minutes. Commissioner Maginn seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

Vice Chairman Payne moved to approve the catering applications. Commissioner Maginn seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

Vice Chairman Payne moved to approve the direct wine shipper applications. Commissioner Maginn seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

WAIVER OF FEES – LETTERS OF EXTENSION

Vice Chairman Payne moved to approve the fee-waived letters of extension that were issued the preceding weeks. Commissioner Maginn seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

RR45-43237 SHIRLEY CARTER – Chairwoman Allen noted this is a transfer with the local board voting 3-1 to approve.

Commissioner Maginn stated the permit being transferred was renewed for ten years under the name of the transferee's mom, who was deceased. The documents were falsely signed by a family member. That family member appears to still be involved in this business.

Commissioner Maginn moved to continue this matter to the April 7th meeting and to ask legal to request an affidavit stating this family member will not have anything to do with the business. Vice Chairman Payne seconded.

Vice Chairman Payne noted if the affidavit is not specific enough to convince him who will be running this business, he may vote no to the transfer.

Chairwoman Allen wants more detail regarding who will be managing when Shirley Carter is not present. Who is ordering from the wholesaler? Who is stocking the shelves? What will be the involvement of the landlord, who is the family member in question and what are the details of the lease.

The motion was unanimously approved.

RR45-43415 219 SPORTS LOUNGE LLC – Chairwoman Allen noted this is a transfer with the local board voting 4-0 to deny.

Commissioner Maginn stated the city and police department were present at the local board as remonstrators.

Commissioner Maginn moved to uphold the local board's recommendation to deny. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. Motion was unanimously approved.

RR71-03567 LINN CORPORATION – Chairwoman Allen noted this is a renewal application with the local board voting 2-1 to approve for one year.

Commissioner Maginn stated this permittee has a history of violations.

Commissioner Maginn moved to continue this until April 7th, to allow time for the permittee to submit a corrective action plan, by March 31st, regarding past violations and changes being made to correct the problems. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

DL49-32133 RAJSURU INC. – Chairwoman Allen noted this is a renewal with the local board voting 4-0 to approve.

Commissioner Maginn stated there was one remonstrator present at the local board hearing. The business and community have been talking and together feel that a one-year renewal would be good.

Commissioner Maginn moved to uphold the local board's recommendation to approve for one year. Vice Chairman Payne seconded.

Chairwoman Allen commented that she appreciated how the neighborhood and permittee worked together in this matter.

The motion was unanimously approved.

RR49-41113 STATE STREET PUB INDY LLC – Chairwoman Allen noted this is a renewal with the local board voting 2-2.

Commissioner Maginn stated this business had a violation regarding an employee who was dealing drugs.

Commissioner Maginn moved to continue this to April 7th, to allow time for the permittee to submit a corrective action plan, by March 31st, addressing the violation. Vice Chairman Payne seconded.

Vice Chairman Payne stated the owner needs to know what is going on in his business and make sure people working at the establishment are responsible employees. He also stated the owner acted disrespectfully. The Vice Chairman expects a detailed corrective action plan.

Chairwoman Allen noted the last violation was from a complaint called into Crime Stoppers, showing the community is concerned about operations at the bar. Also, she would like the corrective action plan to show what management changes are being made to make sure the employees are aware of what is expected of them and what will not be allowed.

The motion was unanimously approved.

DL29-34270 INDY LIQUORS, LLC - Chairwoman Allen noted this is a renewal with the local board voting 3-0 to deny.

Commissioner Maginn stated the owner of this business has a tobacco store that has had 15 violations. The character of a permittee crosses over from one business to the other.

Commissioner Maginn moved to uphold the local board's recommendation to deny the renewal. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

DL29-32924 SINGH BROS OIL INC. - Chairwoman Allen noted this permittee was denied escrow for failure to appear for escrow hearings. The renewal is before the Commission for consideration.

Commissioner Maginn moved to deny the renewal. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

RR92-43447 TIMOTHY MAY ESTATE LLC - Chairwoman Allen stated this permittee is requesting a catering hall designation.

Commissioner Maginn moved to approve the request. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. The motion was unanimously approved,

RR20-30343 DESSY CORPORATION - Chairwoman Allen noted this is on for an extension request.

Commissioner Maginn moved to approve a 90-day extension. Vice Chairman Payne seconded and stated the corrective action plan was very good. The motion was unanimously approved.

DL53-87314 SAHILDEEP CORPORATION - Chairwoman Allen noted this is on for an extension request.

Commissioner Maginn moved to approve a 90-day extension. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. The motion was unanimously approved,

RR57-17008 FOLLCO INC. - Chairwoman Allen noted this is on for an extension request.

Commissioner Maginn stated the permittee is working with the Secretary of State regarding the Certificate of Existence.

Commissioner Maginn moved to approve the remainder of the 90-day extension. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

RR55-36667 BRL PROPERTIES LLC - Chairwoman Allen noted this is on for an extension request.

Commissioner Maginn moved to approve a 90-day extension. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

RR71-36368 THE SOCIAL LLC - Chairwoman Allen noted this is on for an extension request. She stated she is hearing judge regarding pending violations.

Commissioner Maginn stated there are 4 pending violations.

Commissioner Maginn moved to approve a 60-day extension to allow time for resolution of the violations. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. Chairwoman Allen abstained. The motion passed 2-0 with 1 abstention.

RR49-40045 MIAMI'S GARDEN LLC - Chairwoman Allen noted this is on for an extension request.

Commissioner Maginn stated the renewal is under appeal.

Commissioner Maginn moved to approve the remainder of the 90-day extension until May 7th. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. Chairwoman Allen voted no. The motion passed 2-1.

MM48-30635 CULTURED URBAN WINERY LLC - Chairwoman Allen noted this is on for an extension request. She recused herself due to a possible conflict.

Commissioner Maginn noted there is an ongoing issue with the property taxes that is in the process of being worked out.

Commissioner Maginn moved to approve a 30-day extension. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. Chairwoman Allen abstained. The motion was approved 2-0 with 1 abstention.

RR29-40944 WESTFIELD GOLF CLUB LLC - Chairwoman Allen noted this is on for an extension request.

Commissioner Maginn stated this permit is in the process of being transferred.

Commissioner Maginn moved to approve the remainder of the 90-day extension. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

RR29-97353 CROWN RESTAURANTS INC. – Chairwoman Allen noted this is on for an extension request.

Commissioner Maginn moved to approve a 90-day extension. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

RR49-32631 SARAYA CORPORATION - Chairwoman Allen noted this is on for an extension request.

Commissioner Maginn stated the permittee has a pending violation.

Commissioner Maginn moved to approve a 30-day extension to allow time for resolution of the violation. Vice Chairman Payne seconded.

Vice Chairman Payne stated the corrective action plan was thorough and provided the willingness to correct the issues.

Chairwoman Allen noted she would like to see the violation settled or scheduled for a hearing in the 30 days.

The motion was unanimously approved.

RR11-23795 MARIO BROS INC - Chairwoman Allen noted this is on for an extension request.

Commissioner Maginn noted this permittee has a pending violation and a history of similar violations.

Commissioner Maginn moved to continue this until April 7th, to allow time for a corrective action plan to be submitted by March 31st. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

RR49-38051 OHSR ENTERPRISE LLC – Chairwoman Allen noted this is on for an extension request.

Commissioner Maginn moved to approve a 90-day extension. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

***Chairwoman Allen asked the Commission to add the following permits to the agenda. Consent was granted.

DL49-30983 KARKIRPA 6, LLC - Chairwoman Allen noted this is on for an extension request.

Commissioner Maginn stated the Commissioner requested clarification of items on the corrective action plan. Clarification was received.

Commissioner Maginn moved to approve the continuation of the 90-day extension. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

DL49-30984 KARKIRPA 5, LLC - Chairwoman Allen noted this is on for an extension request.

Commissioner Maginn stated the Commissioner requested clarification of items on the corrective action plan. Clarification was received.

Commissioner Maginn moved to approve the continuation of the 90-day extension. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

RH49-29992 CLAYPOOL COURT LLC – Chairwoman Allen noted this is on for an extension request.

Commissioner Maginn moved to approve a 90-day extension. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

Chairwoman Allen stated renewals were filed so RR49-38827, RR49-38822, and RR49-38826 were removed.

Commissioner Maginn moved to continue RR45-34038 to April 7th to allow time for the Form 1 to be submitted to make a complete renewal before it can be removed from the dead list. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

Vice Chairman Payne moved to make 18 permits dead that were previously posted on the March 3, 2026 meeting agenda. Commissioner Maginn seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

Chairwoman Allen stated there are 49 permits posted to be made dead at the April 7, 2026 meeting, who have failed to submit renewals.
