ADDITIONAL: Excise Police Cite Kilroy's Sports Bar in Connection with Lauren Spierer Case

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. (Sept. 15) – The Indiana State Excise Police cited Kilroy's Sports Bar on two alcohol-related charges this afternoon as a result of their investigation into the disappearance of Indiana University student Lauren Spierer, who was last seen June 3.

Kilroy's Sports Bar, 319 N. Walnut Street, was cited around 2:00 p.m. today for allowing a minor to loiter and furnishing alcoholic beverages to a minor.

Excise police officers based their decision to issue the administrative violation on discrepancies in the physical description on the identification Lauren, who is 20 years of age, used to enter the bar.

The establishment was cited administratively, meaning that a report will be forwarded to the Alcohol & Tobacco Commission for review. Possible penalties for these two violations range from a monetary fine, suspension of the permit to sell alcoholic beverages, or possibly revocation of the permit. Throughout the investigation, Kilroy's Sports Bar owners and employees cooperated with officers and provided surveillance tapes and other information requested by investigators.

The primary focus of the Indiana State Excise Police is to reduce underage access to and use of alcohol and tobacco products. Excise officers will continue to aggressively enforce Indiana's alcoholic beverage laws, particularly on and around Indiana's college and university campuses.
