INTRO LANGUAGE:

Hello! We invite you to share your voice. Tell us about your school and your teachers by doing this survey.

This survey is part of a project called CADRE or the Cultural Adaptation of Developmental Relationships in Education. This project aims to make every student feel like they belong and have supportive teachers in their school.

By participating in this survey, we will learn about student and teachers relationships in your school and come up with a plan to improve them. What you share in the survey will be kept private and confidential. Your responses will not be shared back with anyone at your school. It will not impact your grades in any way.

By clicking “next” you are agreeing to participate in the survey. Please remember that you can choose to skip any question that you do not want to answer.

- If I have a problem, I know my teachers will help me.
- My teachers really listen to me.
- My teachers encourage me when I work hard.
- My teachers do things that make me feel like I matter.
- My teachers show me they enjoy being with me.
- My teachers expect me to do my best.
- My teachers encourage me to try things that are difficult for me.
- My teachers hold me responsible for the things I do and say.
- When I make mistakes, my teachers show me how I can learn from them.
- My teachers make it clear what behaviors are acceptable and not acceptable.

- My teachers introduce me to other adults who offer resources or support that I value. [Hover over adults: Adults who are jobs that I am interested in or have a skill that I would like to learn. Adults that are connected to an activity, program, or organization that I want to be involved in.]
