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- b. That suspension took effect on August 2, 2012. [REDACTED] was eligible to be reinstated as of August 2, 2013.
- c. No evidence was presented that [REDACTED] has taken any steps to attempt to resolve this suspension. [REDACTED] letter to the BMV, which was admitted into evidence, indicates that she may be confused about this outstanding suspension. In her letter, she stated that she is suspended until August 2015 and that she was suspended for repeated offenses of driving while suspended.
- d. [REDACTED]'s Indiana driving privileges are currently suspended for failure to appear for a driver safety program.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- a. At Ind. Code § 9-28-1-3, Indiana adopts and enters into the Driver License Compact which provides that it is the policy of each party state to promote compliance with the laws, ordinances, and administrative rules and regulations relating to the operation of motor vehicles by the party state's operators in other jurisdiction by considering compliance a condition precedent to the continuance or issuance of any license.
- b. Article 5 of the Compact prohibits a party state from issuing a license to an individual who is suspended in another state.


VI. APPEAL RIGHTS
