

Daily Animal Treatment Record Instructions

This form is for keeping track of all treatments on all animals in the herd on a daily basis. If an animal receives multiple doses of the same treatment, each dose should be recorded. The treatments can then be transferred to the animal's own treatment page.

Animal ID: The animal's identification.

Reason for Treatment: The disease or condition the animal is being treated for.

Treatment Date: The date the animal is treated

Drug: The name of the drug the animal is given.

Dose: The amount of drug given at each treatment.

Route: How the drug is given. Examples include IM (intramuscular), SQ (subcutaneous), IV (intravenous), IMM (intramammary), topical, or oral.

Frequency of Treatment: How often the drug is to be given. Examples include once, once a day, twice a day, every other day.

Drug Withdrawal: How long the milk and meat cannot be used from the animal after the last dose is given.

Treated by: Name of person administering the drug.

Date Milk Withdrawal Expires: The date that the milk can be used for human consumption and can go in the bulk tank again. Indicate AM/PM milking.

Date Meat Withdrawal Expires: This is the date the animal can be shipped off the farm for slaughter.
