Background	 In 1990, Indiana policy makers created a program to help raise the educational aspirations and attainment of low and moderate income Indiana families. Administered through the State Student Assistance Commission of Indiana, the Twenty-First Century Scholars Program aims to ensure that all Indiana families can afford a college education for their children. By Indiana code (IC 20-12-70), the program was established to: Reduce the number of students who withdrew from high school before graduation Increase the number of students prepared to enter the workforce upon graduation Increase the number of students entering institutions of higher learning Encourage eligible students to attend institutions of higher learning by reducing the financial burdens on the eligible students and their families Decrease drug and alcohol abuse by encouraging higher educational pursuits Improve the overall quality of life for many Indiana residents
