



# 2017 Legislative Summary

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# SEA 198: Workforce Development

- SEA 198 creates the **Workforce Ready Grant** which covers the cost for working-age Hoosiers to earn a high-value certificate at Ivy Tech Community College, Vincennes University or an approved provider.
- High-value certificate programs should have strong employer demand, wages, job placement rates and program completion in the following sectors:

*Advanced Manufacturing      Building and Construction*  
*Healthcare and Life Sciences      IT & Business Technology*  
*Transportation and Logistics*



# SEA 198: Workforce Development

## Workforce Alignment

- Requires the Governor's Office to develop a comprehensive workforce development plan with assistance of the Commission DWD, and the State Board of Education
  - Due October 1<sup>st</sup>

## Workforce Reporting

- Requires state providers of workforce related programs to submit reports regarding the results of those programs on an annual basis.
  - Due October 1<sup>st</sup> for each preceding fiscal year



# HEA 1281: Various Higher Education Matters

- Allows for restoration of state financial aid eligibility after an institution closes
- Expands state financial aid to fees for approved Prior Learning Assessments
- Creates a non-reverting fee remission fund
- Requires the Commission to study “Reverse Transfer”



# HEA 1470: Management of Government Data

## **LSA Data Collection**

- Provides standards for the access of the legislative services agency (LSA) to information held by a state or local governmental entity.

## **Management Performance Hub (MPH)**

- Establishes the position of state data officer and codifies the Management Performance Hub in the Office of Management and Budget



# HEA 1003: Student Assessments

## **ISTEP Replacement**

- Replaces the ISTEP test program after June 30, 2018, with a new statewide assessment program to be known as Indiana's Learning Evaluation Assessment Readiness Network (ILEARN)

## **Graduation Qualifying Exam**

- Provides that after June 30, 2018, a student must complete a graduation pathway requirement rather than pass a graduation exam



# Additional Charges

## HEA 412

- Prohibits money in a 529 education savings account from being considered as an asset in determining eligibility for state financial aid

## HEA 1617

- Expands the Commission's fee remission program to the children and spouses of disabled police and firefighters



# Additional Bills of Interest

## **HEA 1005**

- Provides that after January 10, 2025, the Governor shall appoint a secretary of education

## **HEA 1384**

- Sets Ivy Tech's Board of Trustees at 15 members instead of being based on the number of Ivy Tech regions

## **SEA 423**

- Prohibits postsecondary institutions from creating a sanctuary policy





# HB 1001: Biennial Budget

## Performance Funding Study

- Requires the Commission to review the metrics used in the performance funding formula to ensure those metrics are aligned with the state's higher education goals
  - Due July 1, 2018

## Muncie Study

- Requires the Commission to study the effectiveness of the academic program at the Indiana Academy for Science, Math and Humanities in Muncie
  - Due November 1, 2017



# HB 1001: Biennial Budget

## **STEM Alignment**

- Requires DOE to collaborate with the Commission and other state entities regarding programs, procedures, funding, and policy to ensure access to a quality, standards-based K-12 STEM education

## **Primary Care Scholarship**

- Moves administration of the primary care scholarship from Marian University to the Commission

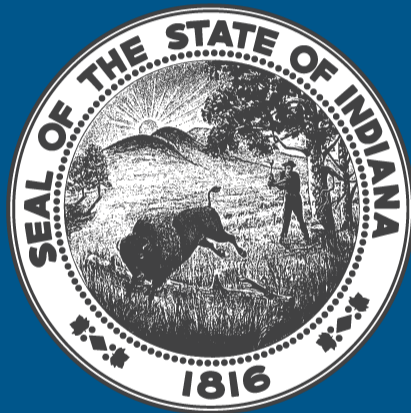
