


ON-TIME COMPLETION


Same campus and degree level



Completion rates continue to improve in Indiana.


At public institutions, 47.2 percent of all Indiana college students graduate on time. 2 out of 3 (67.4 percent) of all students complete college within six years.


SCHOLARS ON TRACK

21st Century Scholars consistently graduate on time at higher rates than their low-income peers who are not Scholars.



GAPS PERSIST

Adult learners, low-income and students from underrepresented populations are less likely to graduate on time than their peers across all campus types.



PART-TIME STUDENTS

91% of part-time students start at two-year campuses.
The extended-time completion rate of those who start part-time has decreased by 3.2 percentage points between 2021 and 2022 and overall increased by 4.9 percentage points in five years.
