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In post-high school training and education **going-rates** for youth and adults – Indiana currently ranks...

- 37th in college–going rate for youth (2022)
- 19th in first-time undergraduate enrollment of adults (2022)



In **postsecondary attainment** for veterans, individuals with disabilities and the justice involved – Indiana currently ranks...

- 48th in total educational attainment of veterans aged 25-64 (2022)
- 45th in total educational attainment of those with a disability aged 25–64 (2022)
- 42nd in percentage of adults in correctional facilities enrolled in school or college (2022)









In utilization of credit for prior learning – Indiana currently is...

 1 of 10 states to have a comprehensive state-wide credit for prior learning policy (2024)



In the rate at which Hoosiers successfully **complete their chosen areas of study** – Indiana currently ranks...

 11th in total six-year completion rates among first-time students enrolling in 2- or 4-year public and private institutions (2023)



In **retaining talent** once someone has graduated – Indiana currently ranks...

40th in retention and migration of college graduates (2022)



In measurable distinction of **social and economic mobility and prosperity** – Indiana currently ranks...

- 35th on the Human Development Index (2021)

As the **recognized state for growing or starting a business** based upon the strength of **human capital** – Indiana currently ranks...

**39th** in attainment among workingage adults with an associate degree or higher

- + 5th in attainment among working-age adults with only a certificate or certification
- = 28th in total educational attainment beyond a high school diploma among working-age adults (2022)
