Meeting State Need for Quality Primary Care Physicians





NEED

GOAL

PLAN

- Each year, **Indiana loses 133 quality resident physicians** to other states
- Indiana **will need an additional 817 primary care physicians by 2030**
- Nearly **70% of doctors** end up practicing medicine near the location of their residency programs
- **By 2028**, expand the number of physicians training in Indiana by **over 350**
- Indiana lawmakers created the **Graduate Medical Education (GME) Board** in 2015 to expand graduate medical education residency opportunities across the state.
- Since the Board's establishment, the Indiana General Assembly has provided continued funding for the state's **GME Expansion Plan (\$5 million in 2022 and \$7 million in 2023 and 2024). Indiana has increased the number of resident physicians by over 260, and residency slots by more than 770.**
- Continued investment in the state's physician pipeline is critical to meeting increasing primary care physician demand, especially in rural and underserved areas, increasing positive health outcomes, and increasing the quality of life for all Hoosiers.

BENEFITS

-  On average, every resident physician who becomes a primary care physician within an underserved area generates a **\$3.6 million economic impact on the region.**
-  On average, every resident physician generates **\$1.5 million each year** they remain in a community to practice medicine.
-  Each physician's practice within the community on average **creates an additional 6-7 jobs.**
-  Statewide, the economic impact of current and planned new resident physicians from Indiana medical resident programs is **expected to reach \$332 million by 2025.**

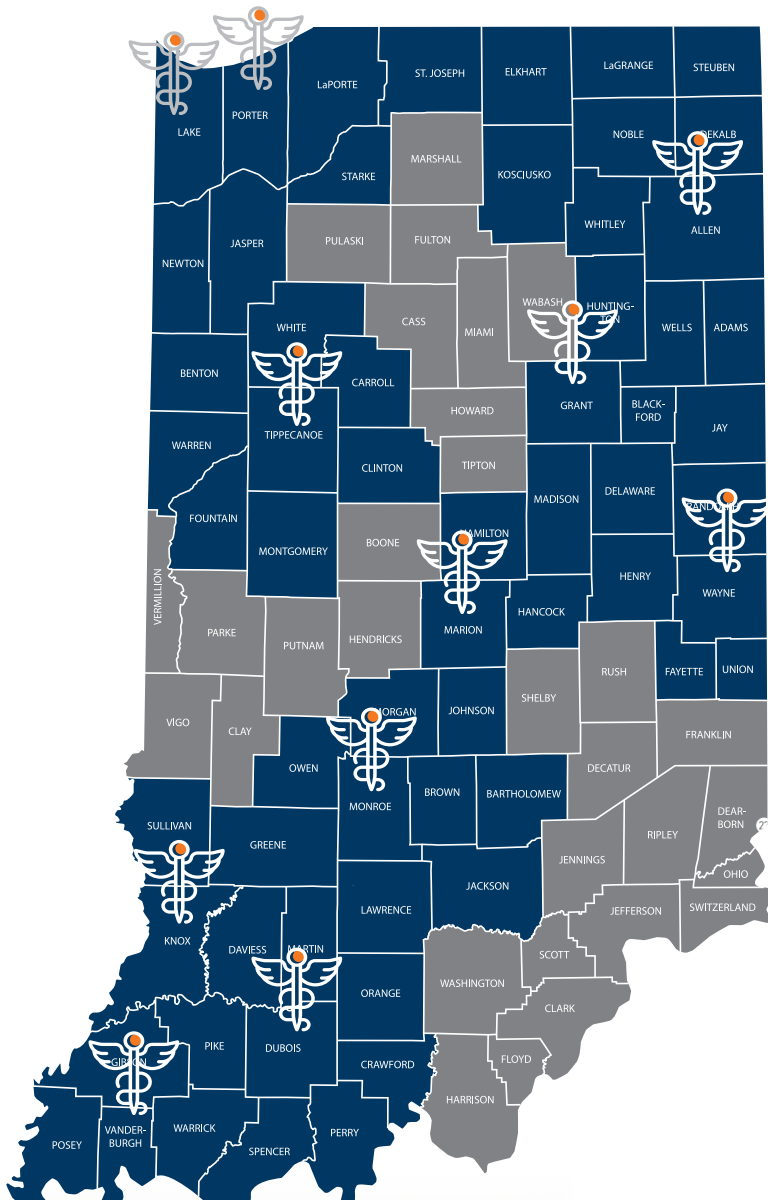

The board may grant funds to support residents who are not federally funded, provide technical assistance to organizations that wish to establish residency programs, cover infrastructure costs for residency program expansion, and provide startup funding for residency programs.
