


21ST CENTURY SCHOLARS PROGRAM

INDIANA COMMISSION for HIGHER EDUCATION


- The program was established in 1990 to increase Hoosier students' aspirations for and access to higher education.
- Income-eligible students are automatically enrolled or must apply in 7th or 8th grade.
- Scholars who fulfill the Scholar Pledge earn up to four years of paid tuition at an Indiana college.

21st Century Scholars are more likely to attend college than their peers.






THE 21ST CENTURY SCHOLARS AWARD



- Pays up to four years full tuition at Indiana public colleges
 - Included: Tuition and regularly-assessed fees
 - Not Included: Room and board, books, transportation, and miscellaneous expenses
- Pays partial tuition at approved Indiana private or proprietary colleges
 - Private: Pays average cost of 4-year public colleges (\$9,515 for the 24/25 academic year)
 - Proprietary: Pays equivalent cost of Ivy Tech Community College (\$5,154 for the 24/25 academic year)
- Many colleges offer supplemental scholarships/incentives.



21ST CENTURY SCHOLARS ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS



- Be an US citizen or eligible non-citizen and Indiana resident
- Be automatically enrolled or apply in 7th or 8th grade
- Agree to the Scholar Pledge
- Graduate with a 2.5 cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) on a 4.0 scale
- Graduate with at least a Core 40 high school diploma or the new Indiana
 Diploma (Readiness Seals will not be required, but are encouraged)
- Complete the Scholar Success Program (SSP) in ScholarTrack
- Meet financial means testing upon filing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by April 15 senior year of high school

21ST CENTURY SCHOLARS ENROLLMENT

- Students who are enrolled in the Free and Reduced Lunch program will be automatically enrolled in 7th or 8th grade.
 - October, March, and June
- If a student is not enrolled in the Free and Reduced Lunch Program but meets the income guidelines, they can still apply. Applications must be received by June 30 of the student's 8th grade year.



21ST CENTURY SCHOLARS PLEDGE



- Complete the Scholar Success Program in high school and college
- Graduate from an Indiana high school with a minimum of a Core 40 diploma and a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale
- File the FAFSA by **April 15** as a high school senior and each year while attending college
- Apply to an eligible Indiana college as a high school senior, and enroll as a full-time student within one year of high school graduation
- Do not use illegal drugs, commit a crime or delinquent act, or consume alcohol before reaching the legal drinking age








- ScholarTrack is a one-stop shop for all state financial aid information for Hoosier students.
- Students and school users with user accounts can (some require a full user account to complete):
 - > Apply for state financial aid such as the Next Generation Hoosier Educators Scholarship
 - Complete Scholar Success Program activities
 - Check the status of their FAFSA, college credit completion, and more
 - > See what financial aid is being offered to students from the state
 - Submit and view appeals
 - Access additional college and career success resources

SCHOLARTRACK ROSTERS



- School Admin Users can create and approve new staff and community partner accounts to access rosters and reports.
- CHE can create new staff member accounts by emailing schools@che.in.gov.
- Community Partners need permission from high/middle schools to be given access by CHE.
 - Schools must email CHE at *schools@che.in.gov* with explicit permission for community partner employees to receive access.

HOW TO SUPPORT YOUR SCHOLARS



- Invite CHE's Outreach Coordinators to help create ScholarTrack accounts, complete SSP activities, and file the FAFSA
 - Freshman cohorts = ScholarTrack account creation and early intervention (GPA, classes, diploma track, etc.)
 - > Senior cohorts = FAFSA filing by April 15 and completing all SSP activities by June 30
- Have ScholarTrack School User or School Admin accounts for the staff tasked with supporting Scholars in your school
 - Community Partners can have access with School Admin user approval
- Participate in *Indiana Pre-Admissions: Your Path to College* initiative
 - Ensure your Scholars know what Indiana colleges and universities are excited and ready to welcome them into their freshman classes
- Encourage the pursual of Readiness Seals for the new Indiana Diploma

REMINDERS

- Scholars must create ScholarTrack accounts to accept their pledge
 - > Students will show "Approved Pending Student Pledge" then will switch to "Approved"
- Graduation Details Collection June 30th
 - Final cumulative GPA and diploma type due for senior 21st Century Scholars
 - Preliminary GPA and diploma type for junior 21st Century Scholars
 - Schools <u>must</u> report graduation details to CHE or award distribution may be impacted.
- Financial Means Testing
- Pledge Violations
- Filing Appeals
