CTE Strategic Plan

- Not Required but Needed
 - Perkins funding represents about 20% of Indiana's overall investment in CTE

- Focused on 3 Priority Areas
 - 1. College and Career Coaching and Navigation
 - 2. Industry and Employer Engagement
 - 3. CTE Accessibility





Perkins State Plan Requirements

- Perkins State Plan is required by the U.S. Department of Education
- State Plan covers FY 2024 2027
 - Modifications required each two years
- Aligns to Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act Plan
- Development Process Required Stakeholder Engagement
 - Review of Current Plan
 - Advisory Council
 - Listening Sessions
 - Surveys



FY 2024 Budget Plan

- ► FY23 Allocation
 - ~\$32 Million
- Administration <2%</p>
- Leadership 10%
- Distribution 88.5%
 - Reserve
 - Secondary
 - Postsecondary





Leadership Funds

- Required Usages
 - Individuals in State Institutions
 - Special Populations Recruitment & Support
 - Non-Traditional Training & Employment
 - Recruiting & Retaining CTE Teachers
 - Reporting on Performance Levels and Gaps
 - Providing Technical Assistance

- Additional Priority Usages
 - Career Coaching & Navigation
 - Middle school programs
 - CTE Career Guide
 - Employer Engagement
 - Education Readiness Grants
 - Scaling WBL
 - CTE Accessibility
 - ► Performance Labs
 - Career and Technical Student Organizations



Size, Scope, and Quality

- CTE program/programs of study must meet the requirements for size, scope and quality to be eligible to utilize Perkins funding
- Establishes a rule for a minimum number of programs of study
- Better defines the scope for postsecondary programs of study
- Will help define quality for monitoring and technical assistance through specific requirements



State Determined Performance Levels

- ▶ 10 Secondary Metrics / 3 Postsecondary Metrics
- Secondary Adjustments:
 - ► 2S1 Reading Language Arts
 - 2S2 Mathematics
 - 3S1 Placement Reverting to prior year data
 - ► 5S3 WBL Participation Aligned to program of study
- Postsecondary Adjustments:
 - ▶ 1P1 Placement
 - 2P1 Credential Attainment
 - New Calculation Method
 - Focus on Continuous Improvement
