INDIANA LEGISLATIVE TRANSFER HISTORY


The Indiana General Assembly began the process of creating legislation to improve transfer for students:

- **2003** Statewide Transfer and Articulation Committee (STAC)
- 2005 Core Transfer Library (CTL)
- 2007 Advanced Placement (AP)
- **2012** Indiana College Core
- **2013** Transfer Single Articulation Pathways (TSAPs)
- 2017 College-Level Examination Program (CLEP)
- **2021** Cambridge International
- **2021** Credit for Prior Learning (CPL)



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INDIANA TRANSFER COMPONENTS



DEFINITIONS

Advanced Placement (AP)

College-level courses and exams taken in high school with the opportunity to earn college credit if the college accepts the score

College-Level Examination Program (CLEP)

Exams that help you earn credit for what you already know

Dual Credit

College courses taken in the high school with your high school teacher

Dual Enrollment

College courses taken either on a college campus or online while in high school

Primary postsecondary partner

A college or university that your high school works with to offer dual credit and the Indiana College Core Certificate

Transfer Single Articulation Pathways (TSAP)

An associate degree that transfers into a designated bachelor's degree pathway in 20 different subject areas


- 2012 legislative mandate
- A <u>block</u> of 30 credit hours of college-level general education coursework that transfers seamlessly to all Indiana public institutions and some private institutions
- Competency-Based

3 Foundational Intellectual Skills

 Written Communication, Speaking & Listening, Quantitative Reasoning

3 Ways of Knowing

Scientific, Social & Behavioral, Humanistic & Artistic



INDIANA COLLEGE CORE GROUND RULES



Minimum of 3 credit hours must be earned in each competency area

Awarding institution determines the distribution of the remaining 12 hours



15 credit hour minimum must be earned from the institution/primary postsecondary provider



A minimum GPA of 2.0 for courses within the Indiana College Core

AP/CLEP/IB may count toward fulfillment based on the equivalencies determined by the awarding institution

 Students need to be aware that test credit will be reevaluated by the receiving institution's policies upon enrollment/transfer



Successful completion of the Indiana College Core does not guarantee admission to an institution and/or degree program



• THE SAME NO MATTER WHO AWARDS IT

- A unique core
- Courses may be different, but the competencies are the same (6 competencies)

INDIANA COLLEGE

ORE

- Not identical to the university core curriculum/general education requirement/foundational studies
- Transcript notation on all transcripts including those who earn it in college (legislatively mandated)
- College <u>certificate</u> awarded when earned in high school
- It is the Indiana College Core, sometimes referred to as the ICC

WHAT IT IS NOT

- Statewide Transfer General Education Core

 No longer use this on websites/marketing
- Core 30
- Core 40 This is a high school diploma type
- Common Core



WHAT IT DOES

- Transfers and applies to meet general education requirements at all Indiana public colleges and universities and some private colleges
 Each college/university may have additional general education requirements to meet their institutional general education core (Ex: fitness requirement, fiscal responsibility)
- Within the university or college there may be major-specific courses required beyond the Indiana College Core

Questions to consider:

What are the science or math requirements for my major?

How many years of world languages do I need to take?

Which written communication courses should I take?

- Focus on major specific coursework
- More flexibility in your schedule
- Increase your academic confidence
- Reduce your stress level in college

- Gain work experience through an internship

- Have more time to volunteer
- Join campus organizations •
- Start graduate school sooner

- Earn a full year of your general education credits for less than \$750 (potentially saving you and your family thousands of dollars)
- Graduate on time or even early from college.

ABOUT 90% OF STUDENTS WHO EARN THE INDIANA COLLEGE CORE WENT ON TO ATTEND COLLEGE

MET BENCHMARKS FOR EARLY SUCCESS IN COLLEGE. STUDENTS DEMONSTRATING EARLY COLLEGE SUCCESS:

- Do not require remediation in Math or English before beginning college level work;
- 2) Complete all courses they attempt in their first year of college; and
- 3) Persist to their second year of college.


WHERE CAN STUDENTS EARN THE INDIANA COLLEGE CORE?

Referred to as the primary postsecondary partner





HOW DOES A HIGH SCHOOL · PARTNER WITH A PROVIDER?

- Steps to offer the Indiana College Core:
 - High School interest form on My College Core
 - Discussions with postsecondary providers
 - Coordinate which courses are currently offered at your high school by all providers, including AP
 - Determining and filling gaps in course ability
 - Identifying credentialed teachers and/or dual enrollment opportunities
 - Signing an MOU with <u>one</u> primary postsecondary partner
 - High schools can offer dual credit courses from multiple providers
 - Primary provider coordinates efforts and reports information to the Commission





- <u>CELL</u> is an educational not for profit organization that is housed at the University of Indianapolis.
- CELL is the organization designated to officially endorse Early College High Schools in Indiana. There are 54 currently endorsed.

- CELL can assist high schools in many areas including:
 - Data collection, analysis and interpretation
 - Choosing a higher education provider for the <u>ICC</u>
 - Professional development for administrators, counselors, teachers and staff
 - Development of an <u>Early College High School</u>
- CELL's services are free of charge to those schools that are in the CELL network.

OVERARCHING GOAL:

All Indiana high school students will have access to complete the Indiana College Core.

COLLEGE READINESS REPORT:


Increase the availability and strategic use of dual credit and quadruple the number of high school seniors that earn the Indiana College Core by 2028.


SEPTEMBER 2022 COMMISSION MEETING:

Increase the number of Indiana College Core delivery sites by 70% each year for the next three years. Have ALL PUBLIC CAMPUSES APPROVED to confer the Indiana College Core credential by the end of SUMMER 2023

EQUITY GAPS IN PRE-COLLEGE CREDIT

- **30%** of Black students and **50%** of Hispanic/Latino students earn dual credit compared to **65%** of White students.
- 34% of dual credit earners are from low-income backgrounds, while only 15% of AP credit earners are from low-income backgrounds.
- There are geographical differences in early college credit.
- Indiana College Core earners are more likely to be White and less likely to be from low-income households.


INCREASE per year for the next three years will get us to all 507 high schools

FINANCIAL AID

- Generally, state financial aid cannot be used for dual credit and dual enrollment
- Dual credit is capped at \$25 per credit hour
- Dual credit is always free for students who qualify for free and reduced lunch
- FAFSA completion is part of the criteria to be a delivery site



INCENTIVES FOR SCHOOLS

DUAL CREDIT, DUAL ENROLLMENT \$40 per credit hour completed by the student; maximum \$1,200 per student

INDIANA COLLEGE CORE - BLOCK TRANSFER \$1,500 per student that successfully completes the Indiana College Core

CTL **87 COURSES**

Completions of the Indiana College Core are included in the measurement for College & Career Credentials for the Indiana Graduates Prepared to Succeed (GPS) Dashboard

Mycollegecore.org launched August 1, 2023

- Created to be a one-stop shop for all things Indiana College Core
- Planning tool shows college-level coursework, including dual credit, dual enrollment, AP, and CLEP
- Student can email their plan to parents and counselors
- Meant to be for planning purposes, <u>not a scheduling tool</u>
- Built-in toolkit of resources for high schools
