# SOME INDIANA RANKINGS...

- In post-high school training and education going-rates for youth and adults, Indiana currently ranks... 31<sup>st</sup> in the college-going rate for youth (2020)
- 21<sup>st</sup> in first-time undergraduate enrollment of adults (2020)
- In postsecondary attainment for veterans, individuals with disabilities and the justice involved, Indiana currently ranks...
- 47<sup>th</sup> in total educational attainment of veterans aged 25-64 (2021)
- 45<sup>th</sup> in total educational attainment of those with a disability aged 25-64 (2021)
- 43<sup>rd</sup> in the percentage of adults in correctional facilities enrolled in school or college (2021)

# **IMPACT OF CPL: BETTER STUDENT OUTCOMES**

### **Increased Credential Completion Rates**

- 17% increase in completion rate
- CPL students were more likely to complete college credentials than non-CPL students.

### **Save Adult Learners Time and Money**

### **Improved Retention in Institutions that offer CPL**

• 17.6 additional credits earned by students with CPL compared to non-CPL students.

### Strong CPL-related outcomes are true regardless of race, ethnicity, and income level.

# CHE ADULT STRATEGY FOCUS

**Goals** include being a top-10 state by 2030 in terms of:


- Postsecondary attainment for veterans, individuals with disabilities, and the justice-involved
- Utilization of credit for prior learning to honor the work, training, and education already achieved by adult learners

**Guiding principle**: Cross-sector collaboration necessary to generate sustainable:

- Supporting Programs/Resources helping individuals successfully navigate an educational system typically geared toward traditional-age student needs
- Systems Redesign creating smoother pathways within the educational system, eliminating significant barriers to enrollment and credential completion

# WHO IS MILITARY-AFFILIATED?

- Military-affiliated individuals: those actively serving in the armed forces (regular duty, reserve duty, or Indiana National Guard) or who have received a discharge other than dishonorably (a.k.a., a veteran).
  - These are officers and enlisted personnel; stationed at home and/or deployed abroad (combat veterans and deployed but have not seen combat).
- They become military-affiliated students when they been accepted or are a current student at the postsecondary institution.







### CHARACTERISTICS OF MILITARY-AFFILIATED LEARNERS

- Leadership and Management Skills
- Work Ethic
- Self-discipline
- Teamwork
- Diverse backgrounds and nationalities
- Proficient in multiple languages

# **BENEFITS TO POSTSECONDARY INSTITUTIONS**




