CURRENT LANDSCAPE



In 1960, Indiana ranked 39th in bachelor's degree attainment, and our most recent data from 2022 shows Indiana is 40th in bachelor's degree attainment.



FUNDING PICTURE

- Ranked 6th in the nation for holding down tuition for the last decade (4 year)
- Ranked 43rd in the nation for state support per FTE
 - Students pay the 5th highest share of educational costs in the nation
- New state revenue is expected to be modest
 - Each 1% of state revenue = \$210.6M
 - 2% new state revenue = \$421.2M
 - > 3% new state revenue = \$631.8M



BUDGET PRIORITIES

1. Operating Funding

Holding down costs for students

2. Formulaic Line Items

Maintain policy commitments and priorities (dual credit & R&R)

3. Capital

Focus on deferred maintenance and renovation of existing facilities

4. R&R Enhancement

Grow state commitment to maintaining what we have





COMMISSION BUDGET



FINANCIAL AID

- Children of Deceased or Disabled Veterans and Public Safety Officers (CVO)
 - Increasing demand driving spend
 - FY24: \$3.7M over budget
 - FY25: \$4.2M increase
 - FY26 & FY27: \$4.2M increase





OPERATIONS

- IT Contract
 - New long-term software vendor
 - ScholarTrack, CHEDSS, etc....
 - FY26 & FY27: \$500K increase
- 27th Pay & Benefits
 - FY26: \$55K increase
 - FY27: \$278K increase

#1. OPERATIONS

Base Adjustment: 1% & 2%

FY26: \$13.6M

FY27: \$27.2M

Performance Funding: 2% & 3%

FY26: \$27.3M

Excluded Entities: 3% & 5%

FY26: \$4.6M

FY27: \$7.6M

► Total Operating Increase: 3% & 5%

#1. OPERATIONS

- 2023-2025 Biennium
 - ► CHE Recommendation: 6% & 8%
 - Final Budget Bill: 4% & 6%
- 2025-2027 Biennium
 - ► CHE Recommendation: 3% & 5%



#2. LINE ITEMS - FORMULAS

- Dual Credit: @ \$50/credit hour
 - \$6.4M increase
 - 24% increase in credit hours taken from FY21 to FY23
 - Largely driven by Ivy Tech (\$5.2M, or 30.5%)
- R&R: @ 0.05% over biennium
 - **\$5.7M,** or 12% increase
 - ▶ 10.6% average increase
 - Largely driven by inflationary cost increase



LINE ITEMS - OTHER

- New requests total \$13M/year
- Increases for existing requests total \$11.6M (FY26) & \$10.1M (FY27)
- Recommendation:
 - Consolidate various operating-adjacent line items based on SEI feedback
 - ▶ 8 requested (Entrepreneurial College, Degree Link, Nursing Program, Testing Centers, Rural Education Initiative, and Early College Bridge, Purdue Polytechnic, TAP-IN-MaC)
 - > \$16.6M in total
 - No support or opposition to line-item requests



#3. CAPITAL

- ▶ #1 priority requests total: \$464M (\$39.6M fee replacement)
- #2 priority requests total: \$298M (\$25.5M fee replacement)
- All requests total: \$1.02B (\$87.3M fee replacement)
- Fee replacement appropriations
 - FY21: \$189.9M
 - FY25: \$149M (\$41M)
 - FY26: \$145.8M (\$3.3M) (\$44.1M)
 - FY27: \$138.3M (\$10.8M) (\$51.6M)



#3. CAPITAL CONT'D

- Average #1 Priority = \$66.2M
 - Similar average cost to 2023 requests (\$65.6M)
 - Significant increase from 2019 & 2021 requests (\$48.7M & \$43.6M)
- New Buildings:
 - PU Interdisciplinary Life Sciences Research Building: 140,000 GSF
 - ► ITCC Terre Haute Campus Restructure: 148,599 GSF (160K GSF demolition)
 - VU Automotive & Welding Technology Training Center: 25,000 GSF (addition + 41K GSF remodel)




#3. CAPITAL CONT'D

- Renovations:
 - USI Academic Renovation Phase II: 4 buildings
 - BSU Bracken Learning Commons: 1 building
 - ► ISU Holmstedt Hall: 1 building
 - IU Biology Building and Central Heating Plant: 2 buildings

#3. CAPITAL CONTINUITY

- Previously Requested:
 - 8 of 19 projects were requested in 2023
 - ► BSU: #2
 - ► IU: #1 & #3
 - ► ITCC: #1, #2, & #3
 - VU: #1 & #3
 - Cost has changed in all cases, scope has changed for a few



#3. CAPITAL RECOMMENDATION

- Fund #1 capital priority for each institution
 - Heavy focus on renovation and maintenance of existing facilities
 - Purdue's request includes \$70M in philanthropic funding (45%)
 - Ivy Tech reduces square footage by 12K
 - Significant utility cost savings by replacing outdated electrical, mechanical, HVAC

#4. REPAIR AND REHABILITATION

- Increase R&R Formula from 0.5% to 1%
 - \$52.7M increase
 - Maintain current buildings and infrastructure
 - Provide funding discretion to campus leadership
 - Reduce backlog of deferred maintenance



CAPITAL PLANNING

- Draft capital scoring rubric to release this year
 - Final rubric provided to SEI by June 30, 2025
- Rubric will establish forced ranking system
 - Each capital request will stand on its own, allowing for SEI agnostic ranking
 - Capital will be reviewed by committee
 - Commission recommendation will contain every capital project submitted for consideration based on final score
- Raise CHE capital review threshold to \$4M

 - ► CHE: \$5M
