

WHATIS THE FAFSA?








The Free Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is the most important document for determining if you're eligible for financial aid — money to help you pay for college.


There are 4 different types of financial aid that you could receive.

- **Grants:** Free money for college that doesn't have to be paid back
- Scholarships: Free money for college based on merit, talent or academic study
- Work Study: Different types of academic related jobs that can help students earn money while taking classes
- Student Loans: Money that students receive to help pay for college but they have to pay back at a later date

After you file your FAFSA, colleges will be able to tell you which scholarships and grants you could receive as well as how much money you can borrow in federal loans.








Step 2 : Gather The Necessary Documents

Make sure you have the following documents prepared before you file the FAFSA:

- Your Federal Student Aid ID (the FSA ID is a username and password you can create on the FAFSA website;
 see the section above for details on getting an FSA ID)
- Your Social Security number (found on a Social Security card)
- Your driver's license number (if you have a driver's license)
- Your and/or your parents'/guardians' most recent federal tax returns (IRS forms 1040, 1040EZ or 1040A)
- Records of money earned, including W-2 forms and recent bank statements
- Alien registration numbers or permanent residence cards, if you or your parents/guardians are not U.S. citizens.

Step 3: Answer The FAFSA Questions

The FAFSA has many different questions concerning your personal information, your family's income information and information on the colleges you are interested in attending. Watch the following video to receive a more comprehensive look at what types of questions the FAFSA will ask.





WHAT IS THE

FAFSA?

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is a form students complete to determine their eligibility for federal, state and institutional financial aid.



Filing the FAFSA can help make the cost of post-high school education and training programs manageable by providing access to financial aid. You can benefit from education after high school because it helps open doors to the career and life you want.

How do I file?

To file the 2023-2024 FAFSA, students and families must use **2021 federal tax information**. The FAFSA can be completed in two ways:

- At studentaid.gov
- On the paper application

Filing online is recommended when possible, and the FAFSA is free!

When do I file the FAFSA?

Indiana students should file a FAFSA between **October 1** and **April 15** of their senior year of high school and each year they plan to attend college.

Some institutions have FAFSA deadlines that fall before the state deadline of April 15, so students should check with their college or university to verify their deadline.

What do I need to file?

- ✓ An FSA ID for student and parent (can be created at FAFSA.gov)
- ✓ Student and parent Social Security Numbers (or alien registration numbers)
- ✓ Parent and student 2021 tax records, records of assets, and untaxed income
- ✓ List of schools to which you wish to send your FAFSA information (up to 10 online)





Indiana has financial aid for all types of students. To qualify, file the **FAFSA by April 15** of your senior year of high school (and each following year too!). Check out these options, and visit **LearnMoreIndiana.org/statefinancialaid** to see all your state financial aid options.

FAFSA REQUIREMENT


- ► The Commission supports a FAFSA requirement for high school graduation with a broad opt-out provision.
- A FAFSA requirement bill has been filed for four years with the bill making it to conference committee multiple times.
- Alabama, Louisiana, Texas, New Hampshire, Colorado, Maryland, Illinois, and California all require high school seniors to file the FAFSA.




STATEWIDE FAFSA FILING

INDIANA'S FAFSA DATA










