



The History of JAG Indiana

2006-2007

- Governor Mitch Daniels implements the JAG model to address the growing dropout crisis in the state
- JAG Indiana serves 217 students at 12 in-school programs statewide

2007-2008

- JAG Indiana serves 355 students at 13 in-school programs
- The first cohort of 57 students earns their High School diplomas and complete JAG program. 65% go on to full-time work and 46% pursue post-secondary training.

2008-2009

- JAG Indiana grows extensively to serve 883 students through 35 in-school programs
- An additional 229 students receive follow-up services and complete the JAG program

2009-2010

- Expansion continues as JAG Indiana grows to 58 in-school programs that serve 1448 students
- Follow-up services are provided to an additional 396 students
- The first out-of-school dropout-recovery programs are formed in southwest Indiana

2010-2011

- Expansion continues as JAG Indiana grows to 58 in-school programs that serve 1764 students
- Follow-up services are provided to an additional 768 students
- Out-of-School model expands to southeastern Indiana and Indianapolis

2011-2012

- Expansion continues as JAG Indiana grows to 59 in-school programs that serve 1959 students
- Follow-up services are provided to an additional 1019 students
- Total served and in follow-up

2012-2013

- JAG Indiana continues to operate 59 in-school programs that serve 1939 students
- Follow-up services were provided to an additional 1089 students
- Total of 3028 served and in follow-up
- North Central Indiana adds the out-of-school model
- JAG Indiana achieves a statewide graduation rate of 90.1%

2013-2014



- Governor Mike Pence and State Legislators approve state funding of \$12M to expand JAG Indiana over two years
- JAG Indiana expands by 47 new in-school programs for a total of 103 Multi-Year and Alternative Education programs and operates 12 out-of-school programs
- JAG Indiana served 3878 students and
- Follow-up services were provided to an additional 1304 students
- Total of 5182 served and in follow-up

2014-2015

- JAG Indiana operates 106 in school and alternative school programs and 12 out-of-school programs
- JAG Indiana serves 3895 students
- Follow-up services were provided to an additional 1989 students
- Total of 5884 served and in follow-up
- **JAG Indiana achieves the highest graduation rate in state's history-93% (class of 2013-2014)**

2015-2016

- Governor Mike Pence and State Legislators approve state funding of \$11.6M to support JAG Indiana over the next two years
- The Family and Social Services Administration approved the allocation of \$2M in TANF purpose 3 funds to be used to help support continued education in the JAG classroom
- JAG Indiana served over 5800 students in in-school, alternative education and out of school programs
- JAG IN awarded 4 Ken Smith National Scholarships, the highest amongst the 32 JAG states
