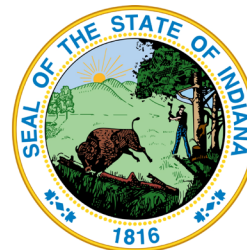

Subject: Gas Tax Holiday Revenue Update

To our local government partners:

As part of Governor Mike Braun's temporary gas tax holiday, the State is taking steps to reimburse local governments for revenue impacted during the emergency declaration. We wanted to share the [recent announcement](#) and provide an update on what to expect.

The first reimbursement request, covering the time period of April 8 – May 31, will be presented to the State Board of Finance on **July 21**. Following Board approval, the Indiana State Comptroller's Office is prepared to distribute payments within **five to seven business days**. Additional reimbursement requests will be made as needed with subsequent State Board of Finance action, with all reimbursements expected to be completed by **November 1**.

Gas Tax Holiday Reimbursement – Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

1. When can local governments expect reimbursement payments?

The first reimbursement request (covering April 8–May 31) will be presented to the State Board of Finance on **July 21**.

Once approved, the Comptroller's Office will distribute payments within five to seven business days.

Additional reimbursement requests will be submitted at future Board of Finance meetings as needed. All reimbursements are expected to be completed by **November 1**.

2. How will reimbursement amounts be determined and how much will my unit receive?

The State Budget Agency will determine the total statewide impact of the gas tax holiday using data from the Department of Revenue. After the State Board of Finance approves a transfer, the Comptroller's Office distributes reimbursement funds using the same statutory MVH and LRS formulas. Individual amounts will be provided at the time of distribution.

4. Will the reimbursement affect regular MVH or LRS distribution timing?

No. Monthly MVH and LRS distributions will continue on schedule. Reimbursement payments will be separate and will follow transfer approvals.

5. Does the Comptroller's Office play a role in tax policy or the gas tax suspension?

No. Our role is to administer statutory distributions and issue reimbursements once funds are transferred.

6. What should local governments expect next?

You will receive additional information once the State Board of Finance completes action on each transfer request. The Comptroller's Office will provide timing updates and distribute funds promptly after each approval.
