Cass County Emergency Management Advisory Council (EMAC) Meeting Minutes December 15, 2022

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by President Ed Schroder at 730pm, Cass County Emergency Operations Center, 1227 N State Road 17, Logansport, IN 46947. This meeting was rescheduled from December 7 due to availability of the majority of the EMAC.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

Phil Rains made a motion to approve minutes of the previous meeting, which was seconded by Dan McDonald. Unanimously approved on a motion duly made and seconded.

DIRECTORS REPORTS

INDIANA DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY (IDHS)/DISTRICT UPDATES (IF APPLICABLE)

District 4 has an assigned liaison again. We have not met her yet. IDHS continues to struggle to fill positions.

Brad Thatcher visited last week. He toured the facility, discussed plans and support sites around the county, and IDHS concerns from the county perspective.

GRANTS AND BILLING

Rocky Buffum reviewed grants and billing revenues.

Year to date grants and corporate support \$59,952.13. \$11,158.72 is stuck in process at IDHS.

- The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) obligated \$5,538.72 in COVID Public Assistance Funding on August 2. IDHS has not yet forwarded the funds. We have been escalating the issue to higher and higher levels of management in attempt to gain resolution.
- The contract was fully executed for the Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness (HMEP)
 Grant in the amount of \$5,620.00. We are waiting for IDHS to open the reimbursement
 submission form in Intelligrants.

Year to date Invoices for HAZMAT Billing reported as \$15,627.47.

- This includes a \$4,752.72 judgement in our favor from a June invoice
- \$5,355.00 currently past due. Staff have been reaching out to spillers to see if there are any documentation issues that can be easily remedied before pursuing further.

Non-Reverting and Local Emergency Planning Committee fund balances were reviewed. \$24,876.84 as of December 1. We have some receivables in transit. We will also be spending down some of the grants received over the month in preparation for 2023 training programs.

OLD BUSINESS

BACKUP 911 COMMUNICATIONS CENTER PROJECT

Project paused while we wait on channel assignments and radios from County Fire Radio Project. This will change channels and equipment used, so it makes sense to wait and do the work one time.

COUNTY FIRE RADIO PROJECT

Radios, pagers, and chargers are at ERS. Mics are now expected December 28, which is moved up significantly from the original February ship date.

EMA Staff are meeting with ERS and IPSC next week to discuss device IDs and talk group assignments so we can continue to move the project forward.

EMERGENCY OPERATIONS PLAN REVIEW

The Emergency Operations Plan was approved by the County Commissioners.

REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS – WARNING SIREN PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE FOR 2023

Responses were received from the following vendors:

- Federal Field Services, \$16,800.00

Rocky Buffum recommended moving forward with ASC Notification Solutions. Jeff Smith made a motion which was seconded by Tracy Williamson. Unanimously approved on a motion duly made and seconded.
