Hummingbird Migration Tracker

With warmer temperatures and flowers in bloom Ruby-throated Hummingbirds aren't far behind! Now is the time to get your feeders cleaned and put out for early arrivers! Male hummingbirds arrived to their breeding grounds first in order to establish territories. In order to make your home more desirable get your feeders out today! Skip the dye and combine one-part granulated white sugar with 4-parts water. Make sure to keep your clean and refill your feeders regularly (every 3 days).




