Diana Topping stated that \$75,000.00 in Riverboat was budgeted for 2024. The contract is for \$176,300.00. \$101,300.00 needs to be appropriated. There is a new non-reverting fund, 9159, set up for Animal control. She asked for the remaining funds be moved from 7303 to 9159, after the additional appropriation is made.

b. Ineligible Homestead Audit Contract

Diana Topping stated the County has not performed a full ineligible homestead audit for about a decade. There was a time the Auditor's office was able to help with expenses by using the Ineligible Homestead Fund. The fund's balance at this time is about \$240.00. The contract that was presented was TrueRoll would get 30% of what is collected and years two and three would cost \$16,240.00.

Denise Konkle asked for a quote for an upfront payment. The Council will vote at the Joint Meeting if another contract is presented.

Ms. Topping stated the Auditor's office would be able to reimburse for expenses once enough revenue is generated.

7. Floyd County Council (NB#7)

a. Discussion – Financial Advisor

Danny Short stated he reached out to Baker Tilly to see what the chances were to be approved for the Property Tax Appeal. They submitted contract forms for the work. They said about 70% of the taxing districts that apply are approved. Brad Striegel asked if they are looking at Baker Tilly case by case or looking at replacing Reedy Group. Danny Short just asked for quotes from Baker Tilly. Denise Konkle asked about historical data. She would like to compare rates. Danny Short asked Council members to send him any questions they have and he will send all received to Baker Tilly and Reedy Group.

Brad Striegel stated they need to be in agreeance with the Commissioners.

b. Discussion – Hiring

Danny Short said the County has had a soft hiring freeze for the past few years. He stated any vacancies have been back fill and not questioned. Maybe Department heads should justify replacing the person.

Sheriff Bush stated it would be difficult since his Department is Public Safety and all positions are needed.

Brad Striegel asked Danny Short to put a form together and step by step explain who this applies to and what questions he would like to ask. They need to have, in writing, how they need to communicate to Office Holders, what the justification is for a higher level of scrutiny.

Dale Bagshaw stated it is appropriate to ask why they need to replace the employee.

Denise Konkle stated she thinks the Department Heads are doing this already. Motion to table 7b for further discussion and more data. Moved by Brad Striegel. Seconded by Tony Toran. Motion passed unanimously.

c. Discussion – Exploring COLA increase

Danny Short stated he would like them to start thinking about Cost of Living for next budget year since inflation has cooled. They made a commitment to get salaries to where they should be with a COLA and how they should proceed going forward.

Denise Konkle stated they need to look at the growth quotient. They cannot give raises above it.

d. Discussion – Current Budget

Danny Short stated he would like them to go back and look at the budgets that they each worked on last year and reach out with questions.

Brad Striegel said that is the purpose of the budget hearing.

Denise Konkle said she would like to empower Department Heads to come to them for cost savings.

Jim Freiberger stated this ties to the hiring practices. He does not want to fire an employee but if that position is gone they have the opportunity to look at it differently.

e. October Meeting Schedule

The October Budget Adoption and Council Meetings are rescheduled for October 17 at 5:00pm for Budget Adoption and 5:30pm for Council Meeting.

Committee Reports

Dale Bagshaw participated, with the Commissioners, with Envoy. The structural and asbestos analysis is to start in a couple weeks.

Connie Moon attended JRAC meeting. They are working on additional funding for Community Partners. They are in full force to issue the checks mid-May for Opioid Funding awards. The application process opens in March. The committee will review them and present to full JRAC Board for a vote.

Jim Freiberger attended a Plan Commission meeting.

Danny Short met with the Surveyor's office. They discussed raising the fees for printing.

Auditor, Diana Topping, stated an updated Capital Asset inventory was questioned during the review with the last SBOA audit. She discussed it the Director of Operations and spoke to a few counties to see how they update and maintain their Capital Assets. She is waiting to hear from a Company that performs the inventory.

HR Director, Michelle Portwood, stated there are two more groups that would like to appear before salary appeals. She needs feedback from the members that are on the committee for their availability.
