The team will review the submissions and advise the Commissioners on the right steps moving forward. The team will determine how to approach the Request for Proposal (RFP) and start the bidding process.

City County Building:

 Reedy Financial Group is preparing financing options for the consideration of the Commissioners and Council. This step is intended to establish a target budget for the county's investment of the two projects.
