RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF FLOYD

- WHEREAS, on the 25th day of November, 1975, at the New Albany-Floyd County Public Library, 180 West Spring Street, New Albany, Indiana, a public hearing was held regarding current design plans for a proposed new grade separation, without ramps, at Klerner Lane and IR-265, Floyd County, Indiana; and
- WHEREAS, it was announced that the proposed project contemplated the construction of a 24 foot, high-type pavement, with 11-foot shoulders on each outside edge of new pavement, and a new grade separation over IR-265 with a clear roadway width of 44 feet, said construction to begin at a point approximately 0.33 miles north of Mount Tabor Road, on existing Klerner Lane, and extending in a northerly direction with a terminus at a point on Klerner Lane approximately 0.018 miles north of the intersection therewith of Maevi Drive; and
- WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the County of Floyd, being fully apprised and informed of the social, economic, environmental, and ecological impacts of the project, as well as the current estimated cost thereof, is now desirous of expressing its support for the prompt completion thereof.

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Indiana State Highway Commission be, and hereby is informed, that the Board of Commissioners of the County of Floyd fully supports the proposed construction of a grade separation at Klerner Lane and IR-265, Floyd County, Indiana, it being the belief of the Board that the completion of such project will benefit the community by an improvement of traffic flow at this location.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Indiana State Highway Commission be, and hereby is, encouraged to proceed expeditiously with this project, with such support and assistance as may be rendered by this Board.
