WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States in considering legislation which will extend the General Revenue Sharing Program; and

WHEREAS, the program, which expired on 30 September 1980, must be reauthorized during the lame duck session beginning 12 November 1980; and

WHEREAS, S 2574 and H.R. 7112 call for this reauthorization and the President has indicated support for the program's continuation; and

WHEREAS, the General Revenue Sharing Program has the lowest administrative costs of any of the federal assistance programs, is distributed on a fair and equitable basis, and provides recipient jurisdictions much needed flexibility in delivering locally determined services and programs; and

WHEREAS, Floyd County, Indiana, utilizes Revenue Sharing Funds to provide capital improvements throughout the County, a practice which would have to be discontinued if Revenue Sharing Funds are discontinued;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners, of the County of Floyd, State of Indiana, that we strongly urge the Congress to take up and pass, and the President to sign, legislation reauthorizing the General Revenue Sharing Program.
