WHEREAS, a 1994 River Hills District OEDP Program Update has been completed;



Assurance of adequate future solid waste disposal capacity and facilities.	Crucial issue being addressed	A
Improved or new bridges in strategic areas. One County bridge is currently closed and approximately eleven are critically in need of repair.	Economic and safety constraint being addressed	B
New or expanded existing industrial areas.	Important for future economic development	B
Roadway and other infrastructure improvements to industrial areas throughout the county.	Existing development constraint City of New Albany is addressing	C
Rail spur to new industrial park in Nothern New Albany.	Secondary development constraint	C
Improve water service in industrial areas, including pressure and flow improvements in the New Albany Industrial Park area.	Constraint being addressed	C
Drainage improvements in Georgetown and strategic areas.	Severe County-wide need	A
Provision of sanitary sewers in rapidly developing areas in Floyd County.	Crucial long term need feasibility evaluation need	A

Identification of a feasible method to serve rural areas of Floyd County with sewer (possibly a County Wide District).	Requires feasibility planning	A
Sewer extensions are a serious need for residential areas along Grant Line Road and County Line Road.	Crucial public welfare need being addressed	B
An adequately sized sewer line is needed for the planned sewer extension from New Albany to Georgetown to accommodate future growth in other developing areas.	Crucial being partially addressed	B

Adequate space set aside for future industrial development with proper infrastructure. The location should be in an area where surrounding land usage will be compatible.

C

Some form of consistent, reliable, and long term Emergency Medical Service.

Crucial public welfare issue

A

Improved fair ground facilities.

Important priority

B

Any incentives, infrastructure improvements or other actions that would improve the County's business climate or otherwise facilitate job creation.

Economic development priority

A

Priority A -

Project must be considered a priority to the community's economic well being or quality of life by the local unit of government having jurisdiction over the benefiting area.

Project must, in a crucial manner, either:

1. Represent a constraint to economic development
2. Constitute a serious threat to the health, safety, well being, or quality of life of affected residents. Or,
3. Respond to a serious economic, social or fiscal threat or problem.

Priority B -

Projects must be a community priority which are important but not crucial, as described above, or are crucial but do not appear feasible due to financial, physical, environmental, or other constraints.

Priority C -

Projects which are desirable by the community, are a secondary priority, or otherwise do not meet the criteria of priority A or B.
