Family Recovery Court is available to families who have an open CHINS (Child in Need of Services) case in Jennings County due to substance use or addiction. To be eligible for the program, families must be willing to commit to the intensive treatment and support services offered by the Court.

HOW DOES FAMILY RECOVERY COURT WORK?

Family Recovery Court is a team-based approach that involves judges, attorneys, social workers, and treatment providers working together to support families in their recovery journey. The Court provides intensive supervision and support to families, including regular court appearances, drug testing, and monitoring of treatment progress. Families also have access to a range of support services, including substance use treatment, counseling, and parenting classes.
