A RESOLUTION HONORING CAMERON (MONTY) WOLF AND HIS SERVICE TO MARTIN COUNTY

WHEREAS, The Martin County Board of Commissioners does recognize the valuable services and contributions in the area of emergency services provided to Martin County and its citizens by Cameron (Monty) Wolf, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MARTIN COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS, as follows:

The Martin County Board of Commissioners now recognize Cameron (Monty) Wolf for his service to Martin County and the citizens of Martin County. Monty has served the citizens of Indiana and particularly those of Martin County well and dutifully for over 50 years. It is difficult to pinpoint exactly when Monty began his service, but it is believed to be in the early 1970's. He started participating in emergency services and volunteer firefighting by working with his father, Camden Lee Wolf. When Lee retired in 1988, Monty succeeded him as Director of Emergency Services. Basically, Monty has been around practically forever.

Monty has done everything that can be considered emergency services. First, he has always been a volunteer firefighter. He has served as a firefighter and recruited and trained firefighters. He was responsible for obtaining the first set of self-contained breathing apparatus for local firefighters. Monty has initiated the acquisition of fire and emergency vehicles, extrication tools, and all types of emergency equipment necessary for provision of the safety of all of Martin County.

Monty's services for the benefit of Martin County citizens have included providing traffic control at ballgames and festivals. He has fought fires, supervised fire responses, and coordinated local emergency services during the blizzard of 1978 as well as our recent 2026 snow event. Monty has responded to chemical spills, floods, tornados, snow, ice, wind, and accidents over his years of service. His responsibilities have included obtaining emergency training and coordinating emergency responses with federal and state agencies. Disaster declarations, both state and local, have been initiated and administered under Monty's supervision. The County Emergency Services Building was built and equipped due to the vision and initiative of Monty Wolf. There have also been numerous grants for services and equipment obtained due to his attention as well.

All these services have been provided to Martin County and its citizens voluntarily and at little compensation. Monty has provided his volunteer work while working full-time in the automotive body services field and raising and maintaining a family. The Board of Commissioners recognize that Monty could not have provided his service without the support of others. That support starts at home. His spouse, Melody, and daughters, Alicia and April, have shared Monty and his talents with all of Martin County. Also, Monty's service would have had little affect without the contribution and participation of all our emergency service volunteers past and present.

Monty Wolf's contributions to the citizens of Martin County have been immense. In recognition of his leadership and contributions for Martin County, the Martin County Board of Commissioners are hereby naming the Emergency Management Building in honor of Monty. Hereafter, the Emergency Management Building shall be named the Cameron (Monty) Wolf Emergency Services Building.






