Denise Lemmon, Council President, called the meeting to order at approximately 1:00PM.

#### **CORRESPONDENCE**

- TIFF information Town of Avilla notice of public hearing.
- There was a letter received from Jerry Jansen (who was not attendance at today's meeting)
  concerning the clawbacks for abatements and his opinion of what needed to happen to
  implement this policy. No decision was made on this topic today.

### MINUTES

Minutes of the March 7, 2022 meeting were read and approved as written with a motion from George Bennett and a second from Bernie Lawson. Motion carried 5-0.

## **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

Denise Lemmon reported that the factoring committee had met and factored the full-time nurse's position. The salary committee must meet next and will do so prior to the next meeting.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

Regional Development Ordinance that was proposed prior to this meeting was brought to the council for adoption. This will be to allow the council's membership in the Regional Development Authority. Motion to sign the ordinance came from Doug Harp. Tom Janes seconded and the motion carried 5-0.

# HIGHWAY

Richard Rogers, Highway Superintendent, had the following construction report for the council:

- The department is patching and grading at this time.
- They have started some culvert work as well.
- The road evaluation process has started.
- The new John Deere loader has arrived and there is a session set for how to operate the new loader.

Zack Smith, Highway Engineer, has the following engineering update for the council:

- Zack reported to the council that at the Council's recommendation the commissioner passed the new Buggy Ordinance. Ordinance 2022-08 dated March 14, 2022 with an effective date of January 1, 2023
- The 2<sup>nd</sup> HMA projects for 2021 is still needing a "notice to proceed from the State.
- The HMA projects for 2022 have been sent in and Zack is awaiting notification of award.

- All nine of the LPA projects are going well with 400 N and Bridge 136 undergoing right of way purchases.
- New LPA projects. Three projects were submitted to INDOT. 2 of the 3 were awarded those being the Riley Road at Appleman intersection and Bridge 59. The Old State Road 3 project was denied.

#### **ANNEX**

Zack Smith, Project Manager, the project is nearing completion, with just minor things that need addressed.

Zack reported that there has been a scheduling of the moving of departments with the courthouse and Weber Road to move in June, the prosecutor and public defender to move in August and the later in August the probation would move to the abandoned prosecutor's office.

Zack is working on signage for rooms and elevators etc. and hopes to plan a ribbon cutting ceremony for the first week of June.

The lobby area will be the final phase of work and Zack had samples of the historical map that will be the vocal point of the lobby.

#### **COURTHOUSE RENOVATION**

American StructurePoint has submitted its Property Condition Assessment along with a cost estimate of renovation costs in the amount of \$3,937,483.

## **COLOR MASTER**

Kyle Skaggs, owner of Color Master, was present to introduce himself and inform the council about the business. He thanked the Council members for allowing the abatement for his company at their last meeting. He reported that business was fantastic and the expansion was proof of that. He did refer to some issues with the complex on State Road 6 with sewer and water issues. He was unsure if the county would have any funding available to help improve this issue.

#### **B & J MEDICAL ABATEMENT**

Kerry Leitch, B & J Medical, is present to request an abatement on personal property. Kerry explained that a unit is in the facility and they are "test driving" it at this point. The equipment has not been purchased to date. This is a Lathe machine and Kerry indicated that B & J has purchased more of these Star Lathes than any other company in Indiana. The equipment is expected to be in operation in May of this year. The company recently has added 26 new employees and with this operation plans to hire an additional 11 employees. The abatement request is for \$6,801,082. Motion to approve the abatement came from Doug Harp. Bernie Lawson seconded and motion carried 5-0.

## SUPERIOR I

Judge Steven Clouse was present to request that a new employee be allowed to start a couple of weeks prior to the retirement of one of his employees. This would be to allow some training to happen prior to the retirement. Judge Clouse has had to hire a new employee upon arrival and now his Court Reporter retired on March 31, 2022 and now his Court Bailiff will be retiring. The one remaining employee with experience has stepped into the reporter's job and is learning that process on her own and has little time to train the other 3 new employees. With older employees leaving who had a number of years' experience and longevity and the 10% reduction in pay for new employees in place it may not have much affect on the current budget. Tom Janes moved to approve the early start for the new employee. George Bennett seconded the motion and motion carried 5-0.
