### **NEW BUSINESS**

I. dianna Huddleston, VP of Community Partnerships, Aspire Indiana, introduced herself and provided an overview of Aspire. dianna will be a regular member to our local JRAC Council. She is also a member of JRAC in Boone, Hamilton, and Madison Counties.

- Aspire is our new community mental health center.
  - <https://www.aspireindiana.org/>
  - They are renting the former Gallahue building for one year to determine their needs and patient volume before purchasing a permanent location.
  - They will begin seeing critical patients next week.
  - Taking over apartment-based patients that were involved with Gallahue.
  - They don't offer transportation.
  - Meeting with local schools to offer services as needed.
  - Provide electronic devices on site for virtual appointments, working on getting those services up and running.
- Hosting a Compassion Gallery at the Children's Museum on December 10, 2025.
- Aspire owns/operates Progress House and Mockingbird Hills.
- Progress House is in Indianapolis and has been in business 63 years (Aspire took over PH 6 years ago). They house approximately 90 men.
- Mockingbird Hills is in Anderson and houses approximately 60 men.
- Aspire offers:
  - Virtual services and in-person services
  - Same day access at all outpatient locations (addictions and behavioral health)
    - don't have to be in crisis to utilize this service
  - Veteran services

- 24-hour crisis line
  - Mobile Crisis - 988 designees
    - 1.5-hour turnaround for crisis call out
    - Choices still available via 988
    - Officers can call 988 or Aspire directly for assistance
  - 24-hour psychiatric urgent care and stabilization center (Rely Center in Noblesville) opened last week (anyone 5 years and older).
  - Goal is to have stabilization units within 100 miles of all Hoosiers.

## DISCUSSION

Xanadu White, Jane Pauley Community Health Center, was present and provided the follow updates:

- Groups for addictions services are scheduled to start after the first of the year. Some groups will be adults only.
- Hiring new therapist.
