Program Overview

Shelby County Community Correction's Juvenile Division Community Service-Learning Program (CSL) was modeled after the Giving Back Program. Projects are sought throughout the community of non-profit and governmental agencies that bring about meaningful, restorative dimensions that increase the potential to raise civic awareness among juvenile offenders. Service Learning is a teaching strategy that links skills and knowledge learned, to issues, needs and problems offenders identify in their community. Service learning builds critical thinking and problem-solving skills and helps to build constructive change through meaningful and working relationships with people outside their peer group. This program is designed to create community pride and build a deeper understanding of the causes and effects of community problems to gain a sense of their own effectiveness and recognize the need for involvement.

Duration:	Dependant upon the number of participants assigned by the court or by the juvenile case manager or probation officer as a sanction. Hours will be spaced out and assigned according to project availability and outside agency hours. Most projects will be in a morning or afternoon with some lasting a full day.
Length:	Dependent upon project availability, number of participants assigned, outside agency hours, and participant and supervisor schedules.
Frequency:	Saturdays, some evenings during the school year, weekdays during the summer.
Location:	Various non-profit and/or government agencies located throughout Shelby County.
