

ORDINANCE # 93-1

WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the Commissioners for the County of Wabash, State of Indiana, that possible disputes or differences of opinion might arise in various areas of the county involving the right of way of roads being a part of the county highway system; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the county, and all landowners in the county, for this issue to be resolved with uniformity, clarity, and absolute consistency; and


WHEREAS, it is appropriate and correct for all county roadways to be a minimum of forty feet (40') in width;

NOW THEREFORE, the Commissioners of Wabash County, after motion duly made and unanimously approved, do hereby claim for the County of Wabash a minimum right of way on all roads being a part of the county highway system of forty feet (40') in width for roadway and berm.
