

A SECOND ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ANIMAL CONTROL AUTHORITY  
ORDINANCE OF MAY 30, 1972, SECTION III (c)

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of Wabash County, Indiana that the Animal Control Ordinance passed on or about May 30, 1972 identified and named in full as follows:

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING AND LICENSING THE KEEPING OF DOGS. PROVIDING FOR THE TAKING UP AND IMPOUNDMENT OF DOGS AND OTHER ANIMALS. QUARANTINE AND DESTRUCTION OF DOGS IN CERTAIN CASES AND MAKING VIOLATIONS A MIS\_ DEMEANOR PUNISHABLE BY FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$200 AND ESTABLISHING AN ANIMAL CONTROL AUTHORITY TO ENFORCE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE be amended in Section #3, Subparagraph (c) changing said designated section referring to licensing as follows:

Every person, group of persons, or corporations, engaged in the commercial business of buying, selling, breeding, or boarding, and/or who owns, harbors, or keeps, five (5) or more dogs, shall pay an annual license fee of \$25.00. All applicants must comply with local ordinances for city of Wabash, Town of North Manchester, or any other incorporated areas in Wabash County.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after this passage and publication as provided by law. Passed by the Board of Commissioners of Wabash County, Indiana, this 8<sup>th</sup> day of June, 1987.
