WABASH COUNTY HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ORDINANCE NO. 1 of 1961

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Wabash County, Indiana, and the County Highway Supervisor of said county have made an engineering and traffic investigation in relation to an extension of Mill Street in the city of Wabash, Indiana, from the city limits thereof westwardly to the point where it joins U. S. Highway 24, and said county officials have determined that for the safety and preservation of life and property, the speed of vehicles thereon and thereover should be limited:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the order of the Board of Commissioners of Wabash County, Indiana, that:

- Section 1. Vehicular traffic over, on and along the extension of Mill Street in the city of Wabash from the city limits to the point where the same joins U. S. Highway 24, shall be limited to 35 miles per hour.
- Section 2. Appropriate traffic control signs shall be installed along the side of said highway, so that the same shall be readily observable to motor vehicle operators, showing that the lawful speed over and along said highway shall not be in excess of 35 miles per hour.
- Section 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine of Five Dollars (\$5.00) and costs for each offense.
- Section 4. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon the publication hereof for one time in the Wabash Plain Dealer, a newspaper of general circulation printed and published in Wabash County, Indiana, and upon the installation of the traffic control signals as herein set forth.
- Section 5. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
