What did Lilly ask us to do?

- ♦ Assess and prioritize the county's most compelling educational needs
- ♦ Develop innovative, strategic collaborative, community-based education programs to enhance the level of educational attainment and quality of life in Wabash County.
- ♦ Essential required elements

}

- Proposals for programs that have substantial support from sources in addition to Lilly Endowment generally will be favored.
- Include statements from community representatives that demonstrate the willingness and disposition of your community to implement and sustain the proposed program.

What are the county's most compelling needs?

- ◆ Parental involvement in their children's learning is a better predictor of academic achievement than socioeconomic status or parents' educational level.
 - ♦ There is a need greater parent involvement in the development and education of children.
- ◆ A significant number of Wabash County's youngest children receive the majority of their care from providers other than a parent.
 - ♦ There is a need for training to enhance the skills of individuals providing care for children in homes, day care centers, registered ministries, and preschools.
- ◆ Approximately one of eight (12%) Wabash county Adults aged sixteen and over functions at Literacy Level 1.
 - ♦ There is a need for both family and individual literacy initiatives.
- ◆ Student Learning and educational achievement is directly linked to the quality of teaching that occurs in the classroom.
 - ♦ There is a need for professional development opportunities that stimulate teachers and give them new resources to improve student achievement
- ◆ Business and education partnerships enhance academic achievement and educational attainment
 - ♦ There is a need to create and sustain public awareness and investment in the value of education. There is a need to make education responsive to work force needs, and global economic trends.
- ◆ Roughly 6,000 (17%) Wabash County residents 25 years and older have less education than a high school diploma, Wabash County's drop out rate is 4%.
 - ♦ There is a need to create alternative educational opportunities to raise the level of educational attainment for these adults, 25 years and older.
- ♦ Only 11.7% of Wabash county residents 25 years and older hold a bachelor, graduate or professional degree compared to 20.3 % nationally.
 - ♦ There is a need to promote the value of education, and to provide resources and information regarding the importance and availability of post-secondary education to Wabash County parents and students at key decision making times through the school years.
