

Mr. Belafonte has been honored by such groups as the American Jewish Congress, the NAACP, the committee for United Negro Relief, and the Peace Corps. He has received the Dag Hammarskjold Peace Medal, the Martin Luther King, Jr. Peace Prize and the Kennedy Center Honors for excellence in the performing arts. He has also received a number of honorary degrees from prestigious institutions around the world.

Mr. Belafonte has always believed that his work for human rights and his artistic pursuits gave him the basis for a most productive and balanced life. He has always felt that, "the role of the artist is to not only show life as it is, but show life as it should be.
