CERTIFICATION REGARDING ENVIRONMENTAL TOBACCO SMOKE

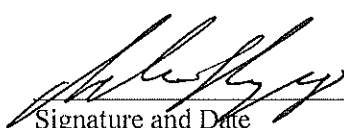

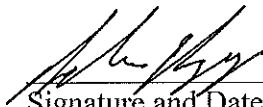
