MEETING MINUTES

2. Roll Call/Attendance

Attendance was taken via the attendance sign-in sheet. It was determined that a quorum was present, with seven voting members in attendance.

3. Review and Action on Meeting Minutes from Tuesday, September 25, 2018

Chairman Corey presented the meeting minutes from the Committee's September 25, 2018 meeting. Chairman Corey called for any additions and corrections to the minutes. Hearing no additions or corrections, a motion was made to approve the minutes with no additions or corrections, followed by a second. The motion was voted upon and carried.

4. Committee Review and Action on ASME A17.1 – 2016 Edition.

The Committee reviewed submitted proposals for code change to ASME A17.1 – 2016 Edition. The Committee took the following actions on each proposal for code change:

- a. <u>Proposal #31: ASME A17.1 Section 8.6.1.2.2(a) On Site Documentation.</u> [John Watson]
 - Motion to approve as submitted; seconded.
 - APPROVED AS SUBMITTED.
- b. <u>Proposal #32: ASME A17.1 Section 8.6.1.7 Periodic Tests.</u> [John Watson]
 - Proponent John Watson advised that the section title in the proposals needed to be changed from "Section 8.6.7.1" to "Section 8.6.1.7."
 - Motion to deny; seconded.
 - DENIED BY HAND VOTE (4 3 IN FAVOR OF DENIAL).
- c. <u>Proposal #33: ASME A17.1 Section 8.6.4.19.7 Standby or Emergency Power Operation.</u> [Gary Herrington]
 - The proposal's additional sentence to the provision will have no fiscal impact, since the tests referenced in the additional sentence are already required in the current code.
 - Motion to approve as submitted; seconded.
 - APPROVED AS SUBMITTED.
- d. <u>Proposal #34: ASME A17.1 Section 8.6.1.7 Periodic Tests.</u> [Gary Herrington]

- Proposed Amendment(s): At the end of the first sentence of the additional provision, change "initiating device" to "initiating devices," and strike/delete "inputs to the elevator control." The additional provision shall read as follows: "<u>The test</u> shall be witnessed by elevator personnel, elevator contractor, or a written report of initiating device testing from the company performing the test of the initiating devices. The written report shall be reviewed for compliance with the code by the elevator contractor performing a category 1 or category 5 test. The written report of initiating device testing shall be filed with the AHJ by the elevator contractor along with the category 1 or category 5 Report of Test for Regulated Lifting Device on the State report form."
- Motion to approve as amended; seconded.

- e. <u>Proposal #35: ASME A17.1 Sections 8.6.7.3, 8.6.7.3.1, 8.6.7.4, 8.6.7.4.1, 8.6.7.8,</u> <u>8.6.7.8.1, 8.6.7.9, 8.6.7.9.1, 8.6.7.9.2, 8.6.7.9.3, 8.6.7.9.4, 8.6.7.9.5, 8.6.7.11, 8.6.7.11.1,</u> <u>8.6.7.11.2, and 8.6.7.11.3</u> [Gary Herrington]
 - Motion to approve as submitted; seconded.
 - APPROVED AS SUBMITTED.
- f. <u>Proposal #36: ASME A17.1 Section 8.6.10 Maintenance and Testing of Dumbwaiters and</u> <u>Materials Lifts.</u> [Gary Herrington]
 - Motion to approve as submitted; seconded.

- g. <u>Proposal #37: ASME A17.1 Section 8.6.10.1 Material Lifts and Dumbwaiters Without</u> <u>Automatic Transfer Devices.</u> [Gary Herrington]

- h. <u>Proposal #38: ASME A17.1 Section 8.6.10.2 Material Lifts and Dumbwaiters With</u> <u>Automatic Transfer Devices.</u> [Gary Herrington]
 - Motion to approve as submitted; seconded.
 - APPROVED AS SUBMITTED.
- i. <u>Proposal #39: ASME A17.1 Section 8.6.10.2.1 Periodic Test.</u> [Gary Herrington]
 - Motion to approve as submitted; seconded.
 - APPROVED AS SUBMITTED.
- j. <u>Proposal #40 ASME A17.1 Section 8.7.3.23.1 Hydraulic Jack.</u> [Gary Herrington]
 - Provided that hydraulic jack replacements are very rare, the Committee calculated the fiscal impact of the proposal as follows: 5 (elevators) × \$1,000.00 (parts) = \$5,000.00 in fiscal impact.

- k. <u>Proposal #41: ASME A17.1 Section 8.7.3.23.3 Cylinders.</u> [Gary Herrington]
 - Proposal will have **minimal to no fiscal impact (incalculable)**.

- I. <u>Proposal #42: ASME A17.1 Section 8.9.1 Code Data Plate Required Information.</u> [John Watson]
 - Motion to approve as submitted; seconded.

- m. <u>Proposal #43: ASME A17.1 Section 1.3 Definitions Authority Having Jurisdiction.</u> [Gary Herrington]
 - Proposed Amendment(s): Add commas where required in the last sentence of the revised provision, so the last sentence shall read as follows: "Where compliance with this code has been mandated by legislation or regulation, the 'authority having jurisdiction' means: State of Indiana Department of Homeland Security, Division of Fire and Building Safety, Division of Elevator Safety, the local building official as authorized under IC 36-7-2-9, and the local ordinance or the fire department as authorized under IC 36-8-17-8."
 - Motion to approve as amended; seconded.

- n. <u>Proposal #44: ASME A17.1 Section 1.3 Definitions Elevator Personnel.</u> [Gary Herrington]
 - Motion to deny; seconded.

- o. <u>Proposal #45: ASME A17.1 Section 8.6.1.7.1 (Periodic Tests).</u> [Steve Stuard]
