- Electrical Code Update Committee Vice-Chairman Popich noted that the third Wednesday of each month should be good, asked that staff check with IDOA to make sure that rooms are available.
- ii. Fire and Building Code Update Committee Commissioner Patarino suggested himself for contractor position. Commissioner Cook suggested keeping submissions open until more resumes come in. Vice-Chairman Popich asked whether keeping submissions open will cause the code review cycle to move to 2024. Tyler Burgauer suggested that, since no committee was necessary, the Commission may be able to simply declare the codes being reviewed for 2023, but Mr. Burgauer wished to consult with the AG's office before formally committing to that position.
